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




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NORMAL COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL THEATRE HOUSE POLICIES



DIRECTORS' NOTES

This play should not be relevant today.

And yet, two weeks before this production opened, over 100 graves in a Jewish cemetery just two hours from here were destroyed. It occurred amid a climate that has seen over 90 bomb threats to Jewish Community Centers in the United States since January. Let that number sink in.

This play should not be relevant today, but it is.

We are told that we study history so as to not repeat it, so that nothing like the Holocaust can ever happen again. But good theatre, including our Fall production of Two Rooms, reminds us that no one wakes up wanting to be the villain; we wake up each day simply wanting to do what we understand to be our best. Human beings perpetrated the Holocaust, human beings stood by and allowed the Holocaust, human beings ended the Holocaust. Human beings did their best at every turn.

Our students have struggled to comprehend the "why" and the "how". And the answer, in part, has to be that fear is a core motivator of any atrocity. Fear of strangers, the Other, the unknown, when stirred with propaganda, mobilizes us to hate. We are easily influenced creatures, and propaganda uses easy answers to help to unite those in fear. If we are to learn from history, the lesson must be that we cannot give in to the convenience of our base instincts. We are obligated to speak out.

Holocaust survivor and Nobel Prize winner Elie Wiesel tells us that "neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the tormented. Sometimes we must interfere. When human lives are endangered, when human dignity is in jeopardy, national borders and sensitivities become irrelevant. Wherever men and women are persecuted because of their race, religion, or political views, that place must - at that moment - become the center of the universe."

DIRECTORS' NOTES

So today we tell Anne's story to let our undocumented students know that they belong here; to let our black students know that their lives do, indeed, matter; to let our Muslim students and others of Middle Eastern descent know that we know they are not terrorists; to let our female students that they are EQUAL; to let our students with disabilities know that they are respected; to let our LGBTQ students know that they are perfect the way they are; to let all students know they are worthy of safety and love.

In the wake of that Jewish cemetery's destruction, it was the local Muslim community who stepped forward to raise the funds to repair what was broken.

Anne Frank wrote in her diary that in spite of everything she still believed that people are truly good at heart and continued by saying, "How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world."

We are grateful that we have Anne's story and her words to guide us today.
