

## DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I'm not even sure people read these, much less follow my philosophical directorial musings, but those who do know that I like to have meaning behind the shows we present. I initially chose *The Children's Hour* because I saw a relevant connection between the unchallenged power of a schoolgirl's rumor and the bullying capacity of social media. Even the news, now 24-hour infotainment, habitually values sensation over fact. As rehearsals progressed, however, my interpretation evolved—it became about community.

All theatre is collaborative, with many artists of different skill sets coming together to create a cohesive work of art. It's thrilling and often frustrating, but this show in particular showed me just how wonderfully interdependent this program is. We experienced several setbacks—illness, vanishing risers, six rehearsals lost to snow days—yet every time, people stepped in and went above and beyond the call of duty to fix problems, run errands, or get the job done. I feel as though any gratitude I express to parents, coworkers, and the cast and crew is inadequate, but nonetheless—thank you for being my heroes.

The people in Hellman's play are not as fortunate, their failure to take care of each other resulting in tragedy. However, catastrophe *can* be avoided. Maybe by standing up for one another, believing the best and not the worst in each other, and refraining from holding power over each other, we can *all* be heroes.


