5. Speak Spanish!

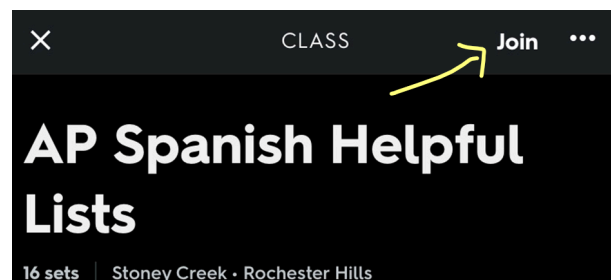
- Find opportunities to practice your Spanish: in restaurants, at work, with friends, while traveling, reading aloud. Any practice is good practice!

6. Increase your vocabulary

I like to describe AP Spanish as “A social studies class done in Spanish”. We discuss and write about various themes set by the college board. I’ve prepared a set of vocabulary lists that may help with each of those themes. College Board does NOT set a specific list of terms that one should know, but rather assesses your ability to communicate those themes. Typically the biggest hurdle for students is not having a sufficient vocabulary. These lists will help not only with the discussion of the themes, but with the tasks set forth by College Board. You will NOT be quizzed on this vocabulary when we return in the fall, this is simply an opportunity to be better prepared for the school year. I HIGHLY recommend studying these quizlet sets in your spare time over the summer. Don’t stress about it, simply consider spending 10 -15 minutes each day reviewing the lists. **I guarantee you will benefit from this next year!**
