Virginia State Science & Engineering Fair

Budding scientists and engineers with a 1st place finish at the Western Virginia or Central Virginia Regional Science Fairs were awarded the opportunity to advance to the 2024 Virginia State Science and Engineering Fair (VSSEF) on April 13th at Old Dominion University's College of Sciences and Batten College of Engineering. More than 220 students from across the Commonwealth of Virginia presented their projects that showcased their aptitude in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Co-sponsors for the event was Leidos and American Electric Power Foundation which helped to provide the grand prize winners with an all-expenses paid trip to attend the international competition, Regeneron ISEF. The RVGS Lab Rats were well represented at the fair and won an exception number of awards. RVGS was a top school for Re-




