# Transition Information

Do I need to  
register?



If you were a private school OR home school student in SY 2023-24 AND have been accepted into a CTE program for North Point High School, you MUST register.

- Go on-line at [ccboe.com](http://ccboe.com) to pre-register for your zoned high school anytime after July 1<sup>st</sup>.
- After you complete pre-registration call the North Point counseling office to let us know your pre-registration is complete.
- Once NPHS has retrieved and approved your pre-registration, NPHS counseling will schedule an appointment with you to complete the registration process.
- If you attended a CCPS middle school in SY 2023-24, you do NOT need to register at North Point. Your records will automatically be transferred to North Point from your middle school.

You MUST be zoned to attend North Point and/or have been accepted into one of the 16 CTE programs to register.

# What classes will I take?

Based on Maryland Graduation Requirements, middle school recommendations and/or CTE program requirements.

## Current CCPS students:

- Course selections have been forwarded to NP from your current middle school
- Current teacher/school recommendations for levels (i.e., Honors level) will be honored
- CTE accepted students course selections will be altered as needed to accommodate the correct CTE required courses and sequencing
- You will receive your SCHEDULE in August at the New Student Orientation and/or the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school in August

## Students NEW to CCPS:

- You must first register as a new student at North Point
- At the time of registration, you will select your classes based on Maryland Graduation requirements and CTE program requirements
- You will receive your SCHEDULE in August at the New Student Orientation and/or the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school in August

# CTE is Rigorous

Students will always be scheduled into program required courses and course levels that meet a student's highest academic ability.

Grades do not = ability

Grades = ability + effort

CTE Programs are challenging and require commitment and effort.



## CTE Courses

Required by MSDE for your program. These are not optional, nor are there alternative courses.

## Required Courses

Required by MSDE for graduation and/or required by your program to support and ensure program content understanding. These are not optional.

## Recommended

Courses that offer supplemental content related to your program.

## Highly Recommended

Courses that provide ultimate supplemental content support and program success.



# Success & Continuing at NPHS

Students accepted to attend NPHS as a CTE student must pass their required CTE courses each year.

## Can I stay at NP if I decide I no longer want to be in CTE?

- No. If you withdraw your acceptance, before school starts in August, you will NOT be enrolled at NPHS. You will be enrolled at your zoned school.
- If you drop your CTE program at any other time, you will be withdrawn at the end of the school year and enrolled at your zoned school for the next year.

## What happens if I fail a CTE class?

- Failing even one CTE class will prevent you from successfully completing the program.
- You will be withdrawn from NP at the end of the school year and enrolled at your zoned school for the next year.

Students cannot switch CTE programs.

# Transportation?

- Bus transportation is provided for all CTE students
- CTE students will catch a shuttle to NP from their zoned high school or ride a bus directly from their neighborhood
- Staff at the zoned school will direct you to the shuttle when you arrive
- Bus numbers, locations and/or shuttle bus status will not be available until late August.

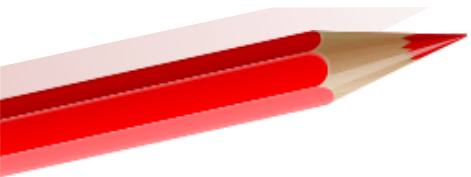

# Athletic Eligibility



- 2.0 GPA
- No “F” grades during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 8<sup>th</sup> grade
- Fewer than 4.5 days during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

Students must continue to meet eligibility requirements EACH quarter to continue participating in athletics through fall, winter and spring sports.



## What is FLIGHT?

## What do I do at FLIGHT?

Students are expected to:

- See teachers for extra help or reassessment
- Work on homework, projects, and/or make-up work
- Participate in a club or activity
- ALL students are expected to engage in a productive activity

*FLIGHT is our activity period used for academic support OR participation in a club or activity*

## How do I manage my time?

All FLIGHT activities and tutoring availability are posted on the NPHS website:

- Create a FLIGHT schedule for extra help, reassessment and/or make-up work
- Join a club/activity that meets each week

# FLIGHT

## What parents need to know:

- The purpose of FLIGHT is to work on academics & participate in clubs/organizations
- FLIGHT is not recess or “free time”
- EVERY teacher has tutoring hours EACH week during FLIGHT
- Students can get extra help, reassess tests, study, work on projects or homework (excellent for athletes)
- Work with your child to create a FLIGHT schedule appropriate to support your child’s academic growth
- Parents can print a FLIGHT sheet requiring your child to have the teacher/club sponsor to sign daily to monitor your child’s productive use of FLIGHT time

- Don't wait until the end of the quarter to reach out

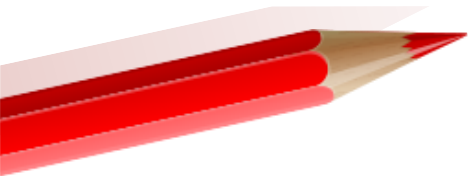
9<sup>th</sup> Grade is NOT the time to loosen up. Your children still need you.
