From Principal Mark Anderson...

HLS has been working hard to prepare your children for the AZ Sci and AASA assessments that began on March 25th. We feel that we have done a great job and know that your children are very prepared to show what they have learned. Please see the testing calendar attachments below for testing dates by grade level.

Along with the test taking tips below, it is very important that during testing all students come to school every day, arrive on time, and not be signed out for appointments. If your child leaves during the middle of a test, according to state guidelines, they will not be able to make it up. Helpful test taking tips:

- Make sure that your children get enough sleep. Remember that old saying about eight to ten hours of sleep a night? Being well rested is perhaps the most important and unfortunately most overlooked aspect of health when trying to stay focused.
- Make sure that your children eat healthy. Often times in our busy schedules we forget to take
 time out for our most obvious needs. If your children are not eating well, we cannot possibly
 expect them to perform well in school, or anything else. Try and avoid heavy foods that may
 make him/her groggy and avoid high sugar food. Make sure they are eating right.
- Encourage your child to stay relaxed on the test.
- Keep a positive attitude about tests.
- Make sure that your child gets up early enough so that he/she will be on time to school.
- Please do not schedule appointments during testing. Students who leave school before completing a particular test are ineligible to continue the test for that session.
- Talking about the test with your child can relieve stress about test taking.

By following these suggestions, your child will have an even better chance of showing their true ability. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to ask. Thank you for all that you do. Being a parent is the most important job there is.



My name is Kole Rowe. I am a 14 year old Life Scout from Troop 828 from Glendale, Arizona. I am currently working on my journey from Life to Eagle and would like to ask for your support.

My Eagle project is to rebuild the Highland Lakes Elementary School Garden. The garden was built 10 years ago and the Arizona sun has destroyed all the wooden structures and the irrigation needs to be repaired. I believe I can create much more lasting structures by using more sustainable materials.

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the year 2024 marks the 13th anniversary of the declaration of March 21th as
Down Syndrome Day by the General Assembly of the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Peoria is a community that celebrates inclusion and opportunities for all its residents; and

WHEREAS, the City of Peoria is host to the World Down Syndrome Celebration at Pioneer Park March 16th, 2024; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that one in every 691 babies in the United States is born with Down Syndrome, and 161 babies a year in Arizona are born with Down Syndrome.

WHEREAS, March 21th holds significance as down syndrome is the result of a person being born with three copies of the 21th chromosome.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jason Beck, Mayor of the City of Peoria, County of Maricopa, State of Arizona, in conformity therewith and by the virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim March 21th, 2024, as

HLS POLICIES

ATTENDANCE CUTS Program (Court Unified Truancy Suppression): To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students.
