Classroom Volunteers

Character Counts lessons will be taught in PE as well as in the classroom throughout the school year. At the end of each month, teachers will select one student to recognize for best demonstrating the focus trait of the month. The focus trait for August is trustworthiness.

Students have the opportunity in our classroom and around campus to earn different rewards and incentives through the use of Den Dollars. We will have a class "store" in addition to the schoolwide program, as well as a "Marble Jar" for whole class positive reinforcement. When the class fills the jar, we will have a class party. We will create a Class Pledge and list of rewards/ incentives as a class on the first day of school.

As per school policy, I will document minor behaviors by using the minor behavior tracking form. I will always communicate with you if this occurs. Consequences may include reflection time before, during, or after school, buddy room reflection time, call home, natural consequences, i.e., cleaning, loss of privilege, seat change. All District Rules will be adhered to at Canyon Springs STEM Academy. Please refer to the DVUSD Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook. We believe that students must treat others with the same respect with which they are treated by the adults in our school. We also believe that student's actions, dress, possessions, etc., must not cause a problem for themselves or anyone else.

ELA

Canyon Springs utilizes the Into Reading literacy program which integrates phonemic awareness, phonics, reading fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, grammar, and writing. Students will write in response to reading as well as work through the stages of the writing process to produce narratives, opinion, and informational pieces. They will also work on spelling and conventions through writing. Students will be assessed weekly on the essential standards covered.

Math

The second grade math program is Eureka Math. Students will develop math vocabulary as well as problem solving skills. Topics include multi-digit addition and

subtraction, place value, telling time, word problems involving money, measurement, geometry, graphing, fractions, and beginning multiplication. Students will be assessed prior to, during, and after each module.

Social Studies

We are very excited to have a new Social Studies curriculum this year, Impact Social Studies. Topics and skills include working together to solve problems, individual and leadership roles, economics, geography, the influence of weather and climate, the developments and change of civilizations and cultures over time, sequence of events, and using primary and secondary sources to generate and answer questions and research.

Science

Science curriculum focuses on inquiry based learning and includes study about matter and energy, Earth and sky, organisms, and inventions.

STEM

STEM will be integrated into all other subject areas as much as possible. We will also complete at least one STEM challenge/activity a week. I love STEM!

Opportunities for reassessment will always be available after intervention/ reteaching. I will use a variety of instructional practices and tools to best meet the individual needs of each student in order for them to be successful in reaching proficiency in the 2nd grade standards.

Grading

Assessment grades will account for 80% of the final grade, and coursework will account for 20% All graded assignments/assessments will be inputted into Powerschool as a percentage. There will also be a proficiency rating for the standard(s) assessed. Students will also receive a citizenship grade at the end of each quarter. No score below 49% will be given. If your child is missing an assignment or scored below 49%, it will be noted on the assignment/assessment in the gradebook.

Grade Scale for Marking Proficiency of the Standards:

- **4** = Applies grade level skills with greater depth or complexity
- 3 = Demonstrates grade level proficiency
- 2 = Approaches grade level proficiency
- 1 = Displays a significant lack of grade level proficiency

Grade Scale for Overall Course Grades:

- **E** = Excellent 3.5-4.0 (87.5-100%)
- **S** = Satisfactory 2.9-3.4 (72.5-87.4%)
- N = Needs Improvement 1.7-2.8 (49-72.4%)
- **U** = Under Performing 1.0-1.6

Homework

Research provides strong evidence that, when used appropriately, homework is essential for increasing and reinforcing student learning and achievement for course standards. Homework may be differentiated to meet the needs of our varied learners. The intent of homework is to practice, extend learning, and provide opportunities for students to develop critical, independent study skills and self-discipline for their life-long educational journeys. Homework will be given as needed or requested, i.e., wasn't completed during class time or needing/wanting extra practice at home. There may also be times I send something for the entire class. I will always communicate this with you.

Star of the Week

Your child will receive an All About Me poster to complete prior to their turn being "Star of the Week". (1-2 weeks in advance) They can complete it independently or you may assist. I will then make a special book for your child with the class, so please look forward to that.

Birthday Celebrations

If you would like to celebrate your child's birthday at school, please communicate with me so we can plan appropriately. Food, flowers, and balloons are not permitted into our classrooms for individual student birthday celebrations due to the large number of students at Canyon Springs with life threatening allergies. I appreciate your understanding and support while we ensure the safety of our students. The cafeteria provides class birthday treats for purchase as an option.
