Introduction to Manufacturing

Introduction to Manufacturing is an exploratory course in the area of manufacturing. Students will be introduced to drafting/CAD, shop safety, welding, CNC plasma cutting and CNC laser engraving. In addition to the skills learned in the lab, students will also explore career options and take tours at various manufacturing facilities in the Walla Walla area. This is a great course for the student who wants to learn more about manufacturing and earn 5 credits. Students are required to have shop-appropriate clothing and footwear. Students will also be required to pay the material costs for any projects they wish to take home.

Health Summer Program

A team-taught, highly engaging immersion in topics covering mental health, physical health, nutrition, disease, community wellness and safety, human sexuality and more. Get this full-semester course requirement completed in just over two weeks! Take advantage of this blended-learning mode—with textbook, videos, guest speakers and hands-on activities emphasizing lifelong skills for better health and wellness.

Crime Scene to Courtroom

Crime Scene to Courtroom is an exploratory course in the field of criminal justice. Students will experience a fast-paced and interesting look into crime scene investigation, evidence recognition, collection and evaluation of that evidence for forensic value. Further instruction in interview, interrogation, criminal psychology and suspect handling will help students to develop a solid understanding of the criminal justice field and how these skills assist in solving crimes and supporting a safer community. Students will have an opportunity to conduct mock trials and court proceedings of these crimes. This program will give students a hands-on opportunity to respond to, process, and follow criminal cases from perpetration to prosecution. This is a great course for students who want to learn more about criminal justice and earn 5 credits.

Filmmakers Boot Camp

Do you post videos on YouTube? Are you ready to take it to the next level? Understanding of the craft of filmmaking is crucial to working in the film industry, in marketing, in social media and in all but the simplest game development platforms. Experience pro-style filmmaking—with the instructor on set, answering your questions and offering timely suggestions, while you shoot. Use the process of making a short film to understand why... developing your shot list is the most important part of your job... casting your actors is the most complicated part of your job... allowing the right amount of time for editing is the most difficult part of your job. Enhance your skills for directing actors, creating great images, blending natural and artificial light, recording clean sound, choosing locations that really help tell your story, developing props and set dressing elements that look right and a lot more... the differences that turn an amateurish production into a professional one. Learn useful, real-world techniques from a professional with real-world experience.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This is a public school summer program for school credit, and is therefore free. It has a non-negotiable attendance requirement for completion, however, attendees will not get credit if they are absent more than one (1) day during the program.
