Riley attended Swansboro High School and was active in the arts, especially interested in singing, drawing, and poetry. Riley died by suicide on February 12, 2018. She was 15 years old. The Riley Fletcher Arts Scholarship was formed to create an opportunity to raise awareness and prevent suicide.

A \$1,200 scholarship will be presented to an Onslow County graduating high school senior who exemplifies outstanding qualities in the arts, leadership, and character. The scholarship award may be used to further the students' college education in the field of the arts.

Qualifications are as follows:

- Student must be a graduating high school senior
- Student must plan to attend an institute of higher learning majoring in the arts and currently be accepted.

The winning student will be selected by the Board of Directors of the Riley Fletcher Scholarship of the Arts.

Applications must be received by the student's school counselor no later than May 1, 2020. Late applications cannot be accepted.

The following must be submitted in hard copy format:

- An official copy of the student's high school transcripts
- One letter of recommendation from a school individual on school letterhead
- College acceptance letter (or copy) even if you have not made a final decision
- Enclosed Completed Application including Essay
- Student Resume
- Self-Addressed, stamped postcard is optional, but if included, will be returned to you serving as notification your application has been received.

Please return the completed application packet (containing the first five items on the above list) to your school guidance counselor by May 1, 2020. Email and fax applications will not be accepted.

The Riley Fletcher Arts Scholarship will be awarded on May 15, 2020.
