- 4 Open Discussion
 - a. Gina Quinn asked about articulation agreements between Onslow CTE and Coastal Carolina Community College.
 - i. Tony Bello mentioned that there are state articulation agreements that are currently in effect.
 - ii. Local articulation agreements are slowly underway and need to continue. This will allow for articulated credit in community college courses from courses the students have taken in high school.
 - 1. HVAC is one course where high school instructors and community college instructors come together to determine which courses would articulate.
 - b. Tony Bello mentioned that Onslow CTE does not currently have a pre-apprenticeship program. This would need to be initiated by Coastal Community College under a registered, open enrollment, apprenticeship. Once that is established, the pre-apprenticeship program could be launched under that.
 - i. Ashley Gurganus mentioned that there is an NC Youth Apprenticeship Coordinator on their campus.
 - 1. Tony Bello mentioned that he would like to bring her to the table with the Southeast Region NC Apprenticeship Coordinator to help establish an apprenticeship with LJ Electric who is interested in launching a registered, open enrollment Apprenticeship.
 - 2. Ashley Gurganus mentioned that he has ideas of Coastal sponsoring the apprenticeship and agreed that a meeting should be held.
 - 3. William Laine mentioned that we are currently updating Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the college including all partnerships and early college.
 - c. Cowanda Bazile mentioned that she has been working with Carteret CTE and Carteret Community College with iCEV career development. She mentioned that they are receiving credentials and would be glad to share the information with Onslow CTE.

- d. Lindsay Gress mentioned that the City of Jacksonville is partnering with and conducting a job fair on Saturday, May 6, 11:00am – 2:00pm Onslow County Outreach.
