I. Superintendent Update and Q&A: Dr. Colin Byrne

- A. **The budget passed.** Thank you for supporting us as a school district! We do not take that for granted. We had one of the largest turn-outs we've had in the last ten years. The budget passed by a large margin. Thank you, everyone, for that.
- B. Upcoming June 7th board meeting: We'll be discussing curriculum and the strategic plan we've been developing this year. We'll also be talking about advanced learning. We have done various surveys this year and considered possibilities, but we haven't summed it all up or announced what we're going to do yet. More curriculum news coming. Please attend if you can.
- C. Water bottle filling stations at RSS have been installed. It only took a year or so to get that done! Thank you PTA for supporting us in that area, as in so many areas.
- D. May 9th water main break and school closure: I do recognize that the communication on that was not great. We tried to get the message out to people in a timely fashion, but the texts/calls went out an hour after the email. Plus, there were contingency pieces we didn't communicate, such as what would happen in case parents of younger kids weren't home. We should have done a better job communicating that in general. I had a few conversations with parents, and I realize we haven't done a good job of communicating in general. We don't always follow up or fully explain. We as an administration have to do a better job on that- myself included. We will work on relating things effectively.
- E. Q: Because you talked about communication- with this recent election, we heard a lot about curriculum. I didn't hear anything from the administration saying, "No, we do, in fact, have a curriculum." Another thing I wanted to ask with regard to communicating- staffing has come up at previous PTA meetings and the election- could you share some information about that and communicate that out to the community?
 - i. The curriculum piece- I did not address some of the comments publicly because I didn't want to make comments that might seem directed against a specific candidate. I planned to address a lot of the comments at the next board meeting. We do have a curriculum. Our teachers have for years had a solid curriculum that they have created, have followed, and continue to adapt as needed. They work hard to maintain that. We are putting in a

few more pieces, reviewing curriculum, addressing alignment. There has been a curriculum for years, based on NYS standards at a minimum, as well as things that our faculty and admin feel are important for students to learn. I should have come out and dispelled that sooner, but I will talk about that more on June 7th.

- ii. In terms of staffing, it has been challenging. Some areas are very hard to fill. You may have heard about the challenge we had filling a Spanish position. In the positions we've had to fill lately, we've been able to find highly qualified candidates. A high school ELA position was recently approved. A new social worker should be approved soon. We do have good candidates for those positions; we are finding good solid people. There is a shortage of people going into education. Hiring is difficult. The most difficult to fill is the substitute teacher position. We are trying to reach out and find people who would be willing to help us out. For the most part, we're doing ok now. I'll let people know if we run into challenges.
- F. Q: Where are we with the search for a new Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment? We are at the end of the process. We've had a search committee screen candidates, and the board has interviewed candidates. We are at the last step, trying to cross the T's and dot the I's. I don't want to jinx that by saying more.
