# Blind Brook MS/HS IMC (In Person) and Via Zoom MINUTES

#### I. Acting Superintendent Update and Q&A: Dr. Colin Byrne

#### A. Construction

- i. Progress has been focused on the cafetorium roof and kitchen.
- ii. The courtyard is taking shape. We were concerned because it looked like so much concrete, but there were supposed to be plantings and places to grow things. We are starting to see more dirt for planting.
- iii. We are keeping up with the Temporary Certificates of Occupancy (TCO's). We have been getting extensions as we need them. We can't get a full Certificate of Occupancy until the project is complete. Our current TCo expires 4/15.
- B. You should see an email soon regarding COVID protocol adjustments. We're not putting masks on everyone, but if someone tests positive at home, any siblings must mask. Also, if you take a rapid test, you're supposed to take a second test 24 hours later.
- C. We had our Saturday budget meeting the other day. There are no major changes or additions to what was announced. We're looking at hiring another maintenance person at RSS. That way, we'll have someone in-house to do things a contractor might otherwise do.
- D. Governor Hochul recently shared information on how to get grants for mental health. We've been working on implementing the Yale RULER program. We're working on identifying, naming, and dealing with emotions. The idea is to change the climate/environment of the schools by establishing a common language and understanding around emotions. Eventually, it will grow to be more than that.
- E. It's getting harder and harder to hire people in the educational world for certain positions, especially in the sciences, technology, and library. We are looking for substitutes. RSS is especially having a hard time. There is a MS Spanish leave. Mr. Horowitz is trying hard to fill it. We have reached out to various hiring groups and platforms. We've had limited success, though Mr. Horowitz just received an application that looks promising. There seems to be a general shift away from careers in education. Hopefully it will shift back.
- F. Q: Related to staffing and hiring people, I know you're in contact with neighboring superintendents. I assume they're experiencing the same thing?

- There is a local, a county, and a tri-county superintendents' group. They are all running into the same problem. For example, nationwide, it's hard to hire substitutes. It seems like a pretty scary issue. In the elementary school, there was a shortage of aides. **Response**: **I would love to hear about how you guys are brainstorming.** I have posted on Indeed, and LoHud/Journal News, without much of a response.
- G. Q: In the last PTA meeting, you said that there were some corrections that needed to be made from the February board meeting. I haven't seen them publicly shared. I would love to get an understanding of that. I will make sure to share that soon.
- H. Q: Was RULER purchased through COVID relief funds? The Ruler program was part of the COVID funds, specifically the Cursor grant, the first grant we had. Right now, we're just in the training phase. We did talk about using the money to support our students in other ways. We're talking with grade level teachers about expanding the summer program. We're talking about doing something for school. The conversation is going on, I wish it could go faster. They've brought up not just the academic needs, but the social skills perhaps students didn't pick up in the past couple of years. Response: I would encourage that because they go hand in hand. If the students who are falling behind have the opportunity to learn with the other students, they can interact and it makes things much more inclusive.
- I. Q: Do we have dates for the summer program? I'd like to design a program around the dates teachers are available. We are working it out. Response: This is also our children's time I just want to be sure we get things in place sooner rather than later. If they fall behind, that does affect their mental health.
- J. Q: Regarding the teacher shortage problem, how does our pay compare with other districts? Is it possible to offer more to entice the teachers we need? If a teacher is hired, they are hired on a scale level based on their experience. I don't think candidates are looking at salary- people can look at our contract online it's available. Salary is usually the last step in the hiring process. We have upped our substitute pay, though, and we've gotten a few more people.
- K. Q: A lot of schools do job fairs, maybe that's another good option to explore-you could go to different universities in Manhattan they have a lot of talent. We participated in a diversity fair to try to attract a more diverse employee pool. I talked to probably 8 or 9 different people to talk about the different positions we have open. We'll look for things like that and see if we can attend.
- L. **Q:** Have you thought about hiring from overseas? Is that something you're allowed to do? I have never fully looked into it. The certification would be a question. They would need certain certifications. There may be a program

where, sometimes you can hire someone if they are working on it, or sometimes a certification can transfer over. Sometimes an employer can sponsor a visa.

- B. Thank you to the parents who have volunteered to unpack, sort, and shelve our elementary school library books! Library circulation should begin next week!

- C. Kindergarten registration has moved to online as has registration for anyone new to the school, regardless of grade. Incoming kindergarten registration is in the low 80s. There will be 4 kindergarten classes, 4 first grade classes, 5 second grade classes, 5 third grade classes, 5 fourth grade classes, 4 fifth grade classes, and a K/1 self-contained class.
- D. Big news: play dates are now allowed on buses, except for half days or early dismissal. We waited a little while after the mask mandate was lifted just to make sure case numbers didn't rise.
- E. Visitors are now welcome by appointment only. They must wear a visitor badge while in the building.
