- 1. Review all relevant information about student's educational and personal background before the interview.
- 2. Introduce self, help student to feel comfortable.
- 3. Use age-appropriate screening questions.
- 4. View or collect work samples.
- 5. Use information to determine if student will take the NYSITELL.



New York State Identification Test for English Language Learners (NYSITELL) Administration

- Administered to any student for whom there is any question about whether the student is proficient in English in each of the four communication modalities (speaking, listening, reading and writing)
- Kindergarten NYSITELL (first half of the year) tests student proficiency in English only in speaking and listening
- Second half of K grade 12 tests students proficiency in English in each of the four modalities.






