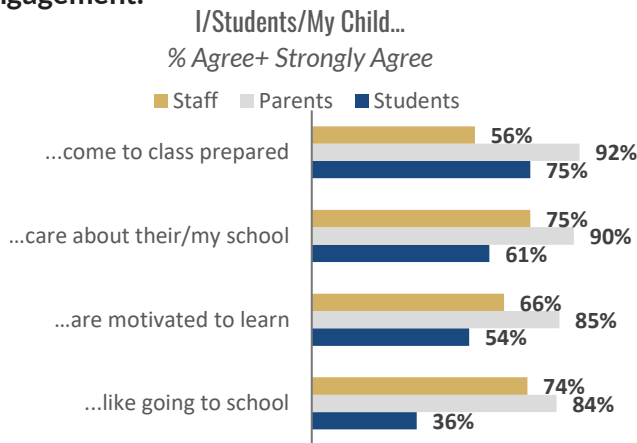


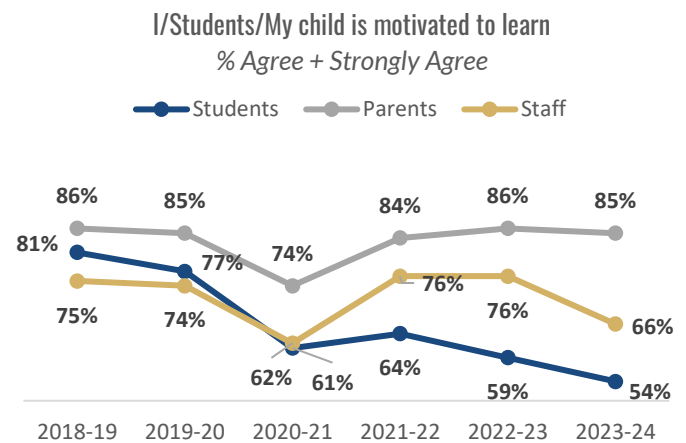
Hacienda La Puente Unified School District (HLPUSD) partners with Hanover Research to administer an annual LCAP Survey to students (Grades 7-12), staff, and families. The survey was last administered in February of 2024. HLPUSD uses the LCAP Survey to gather perceptions and opinions from educational partners and to identify areas of strength and areas for growth within the district. **A total of 4,248 individuals** responded to the survey in February of 2024. This infographic provides a summary of key findings based on the survey results from the 2023-24 academic year and provides comparisons to prior years (2018-19 to 2022-23).

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

Most agree that students are engaged and appreciative of their school, however opinions differ by educational partner group for some areas of engagement.



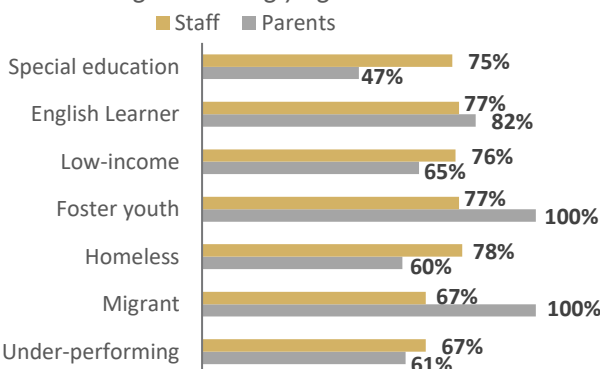
Parent and student perceptions of student motivation to learn have remained stable, while staff perceptions have decreased significantly



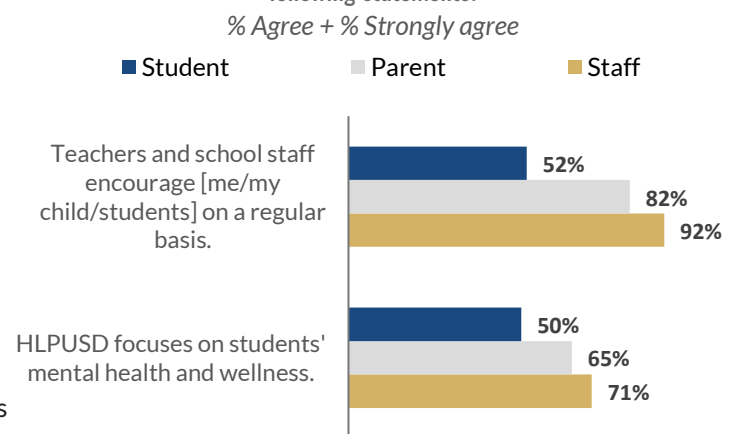
SUPPORT NETWORKS

Staff respondents have more positive views of student support compared to parents and are more likely to understand what supports are available. Most student respondents agree that they receive the resources and support that they need to be successful.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

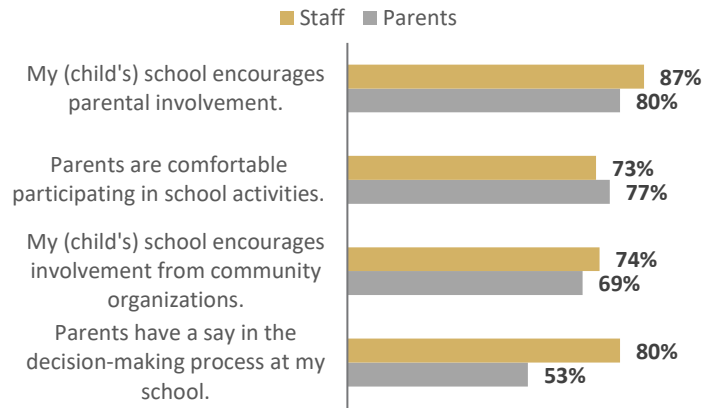
Most parent and staff respondents report moderate parental involvement in HLPUSD. Parents are more likely than staff to believe that parents are very or extremely involved. Additionally, parents are less likely to feel involved in the decision-making processes at school- or district-level.



77% of parents rate parents as at least moderately involved in the district (2023-24).

COMMUNICATION

Parents and staff emphasize better scheduling and communication as important to increasing parent involvement.



94% of parents find they are able to communicate with teachers and staff when they need to.



76% of parents prefer the school to communicate with them via email, compared to 53% preferring phone calls.

TECHNOLOGY ACCESS

Awareness and use of e-books through SORA has increased among both students and parents.



60% of parents and students are aware of SORA/Overdrive (2023-24).

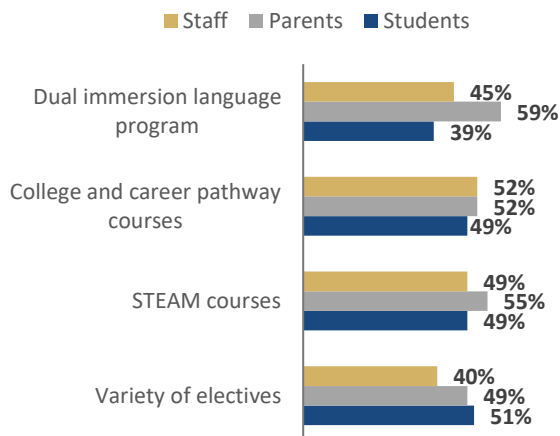


61% of students use SORA/Overdrive, compared to 51% of parents (2023-24).

COURSE OFFERINGS

Satisfaction with course access is mixed among respondent groups. Respondents are most satisfied with honors courses and least satisfied with dual immersion language programs, especially student respondents.

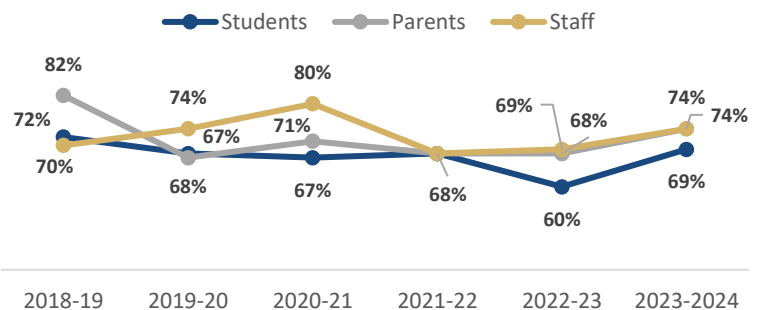
Satisfaction with Access to Courses

STUDENT OUTCOMES

Most agree that their school prepares students for college. Across all years, survey respondents are less likely to agree that school prepares students for a career (62% overall in 2023-24) compared to college.

% Agree + Strongly Agree

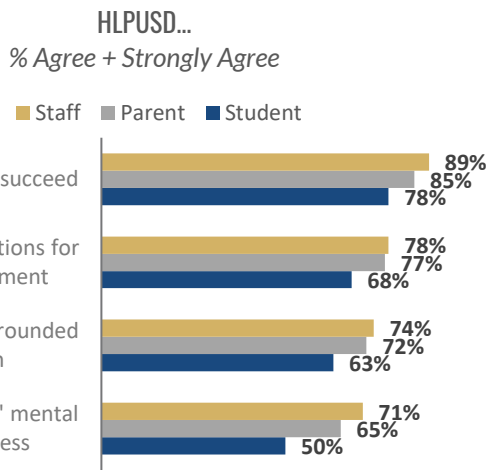


90% of students agree that they know what they need to do in order to graduate from HS (2023-24).

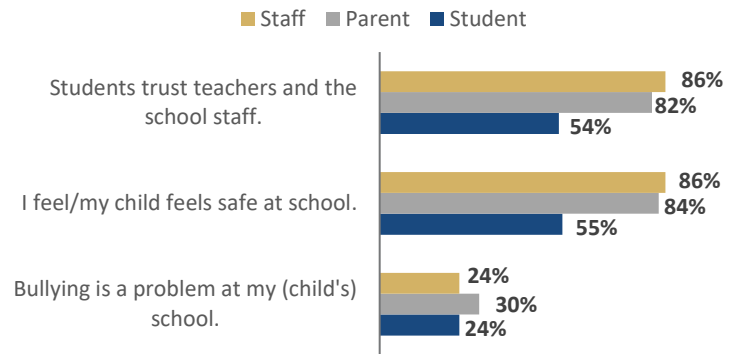
DISTRICT AND SCHOOL CLIMATE

All respondents indicate largely favorable opinions of the district climate. Most respondents, especially staff, agree that HLPUSD provides a well-rounded curriculum and sets high expectations for student achievement.

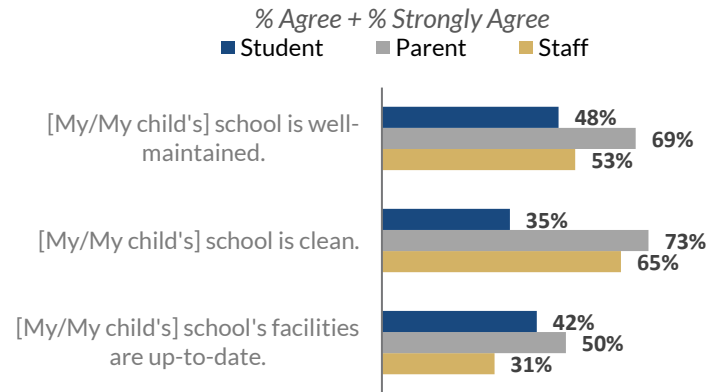
Views of the social and physical environment at schools continue to vary among staff, parents, and students. Students' negative perceptions continue the downward trend that started between 2020-21 and 2021-22. Also, all respondents' perceptions that bullying is a problem at school continue to follow a downward trend as well.

% Agree + Strongly Agree**

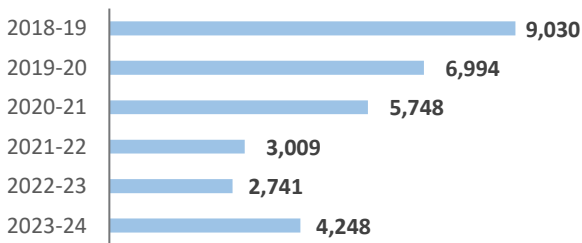

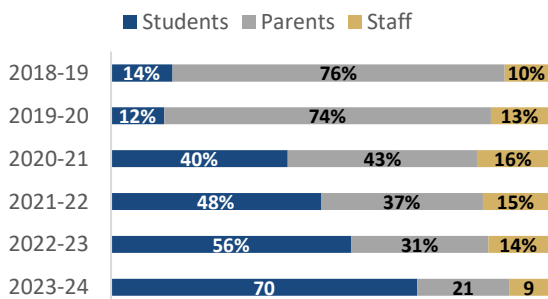

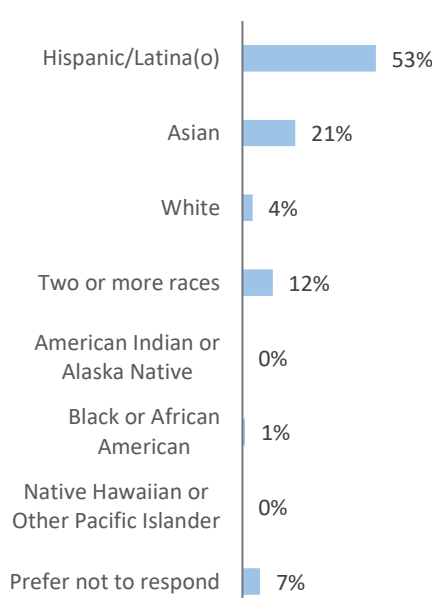
Total Survey Respondents by Year
