Over the past couple months, students in grades 7 and 8 had the opportunity to explore various careers in the Agricul-




ture and Skilled Building Trades industries. Students were able to participate in a variety of hands on activities showcasing the many careers available in each area.

As part of the Young Artist Series offered at Maine Media, Adriene has chosen to attend the "Young Photographers in the Darkroom" workshop this summer. The Young Photographers in the Darkroom Workshop helps talented high school students learn the craft of

This comprehensive one-week photography course uses traditional film cameras, B&W film, and the darkroom to explore photographic vision. There is extensive darkroom training in film development and print-making, lots of fieldwork, along with an introduction to the history of the medium to help each student form a personal photographic vision. The course includes work in the aesthetic aspects of composition, point-of-view, the moment and subject matter. Students learn how to make fine silver prints in the darkroom, tone, and spot their photographs. They also learn how to edit, sequence images and build a portfolio that can be used in college applications. There are daily critiques,

Reminder to all parents/guardians regarding the upcoming 2018-2019 school year.

There are two important changes in Education Law effective 7/1/2018:

As of July 1, 2018 New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K or K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th grade. In addition, these examinations must be completed on the approved NYSED Student Health Examination Form for School for the health exam.

Students entering these grades must have a valid physical dated on or after September 7, 2017. Health certificates are required to be submitted within 30 days from the start of the new school year.

In regards to vaccinations, New York State Law requires the following:

Kindergarten:

5 - doses of Dtap (unless the 4^{th} dose was on or after their 4th birthday), 4 - doses of Polio (unless the 3^{rd} dose was on or after their 4^{th} birthday), 3- doses of Hepatitis B, 2 - doses of MMR, and 2 - doses of Varicella.

Sixth Grade:

1 - dose of Tdap by age 11

Seventh Grade:

1 - dose of Menectra (meningococcal ACWY)

Twelfth Grade:

2 - doses of Menectra (meningococcal ACWY), unless the 1st one was received on or after their 16th birthday

Appropriate certification of immunizations is required for students to attend school in the fall.




