

#### **Dignity Act for All Students**

New York State has a new policy called The Dignity Act for All Students (DASA), which was implemented on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 and bestows that all students in public schools have the right to an education free of discrimination and harassment. The Dignity Act includes, but is not limited to, acts of discrimination and harassment based on a student's race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious prac-



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tice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (defined to include gender identity or expression), or sex. At S.V.C.S., we are proactively promoting the policy with a myriad of student interactive assemblies through a partnership with Mr. Robert Newberry for grades 3 through 11. In addition, we have presented the Code of
