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Upcoming Votes

On Tuesday, March 13th, we will be proposing the purchase of one small and one large school bus. These will replace two buses which both have about 100,000 miles on them. After our transportation aid is deducted, the purchase of the two buses will cost the district a total of approximately \$20,000. Regular replacement of busses over the past few years has allowed the district to reduce its maintenance costs, thus creating significant savings for district taxpayers.

Tuesday, May 15th, is the day the districtwide vote is held for the 2012-2013 school budget. Over the past three years our school district has taken significant reductions in state aid. Unfortunately, these cuts have targeted high need schools (like SVCS) unfairly. Add the new property tax cap to the substantial cut in state aid and this creates major problems for poor districts. We continue to review every line of our budget to find efficiencies and areas that we can trim costs while attempting to have a minimal impact on school programs.

Along with the school budget vote, community members will also have the opportunity to vote for school board members. There are three seats up for reelection this year. If you are interested in serving on the school board,

petitions will be available in the District Office from March 16th through April 16th between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. If you have questions, please contact Pam Mennig at 495-4400.

Please know that we understand that local taxpayers cannot be asked to shoulder the burden of drastically higher property taxes!! We will continue to do everything humanly possible to provide our community with a budget that is kid-friendly and fair to our taxpayers. Our public presentation of the budget will occur in early May. Family Watchdog

Madison County Office of the Sheriff is pleased to announce a partnership with Family Watchdog. Family Watchdog can proactively notify you when a registered sexual predator moves within five miles of a given address that you care about. You may use any address that you want; home, school, church, playground, day care center or a parent's house. Whatever address is important to you. Sexual predators have no physical borders and are not confined to any given socio-economic group. This service uses email as a primary notification mechanism. They receive data from multiple sources and combine and cross reference the data from all sources in order to provide the most possible coverage and protection. Family Watchdog can also track of

fenders and send you notifications if the specified offender has a change. Family Watchdog allows you to see where registered sexual offenders live around you. There is no fee associated with looking up offenders and viewing maps. All are welcomed and encouraged to sign up. http://www.madisoncony.familywatchdog.us

Sport Physicals

In February, parents of students in grades 6-11 will be receiving sports physical questionnaires. If you would like your child to have a sports physical by the school physician, this questionnaire must be completed, signed and returned to the nurse's office by March 23rd, 2012. No student will have a physical without a completed and signed questionnaire. The physicals will be done in April and May 2012. If you have any questions, please call 495-4500.

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KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registration for the school year 2012-2013 will be held at Stockbridge Valley Central School on Monday, March 5th, 2012 through Friday, March 9th, 2012 from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the elementary office. Any child who will be five years of age on or before December 1st, 2012 is eligible to be enrolled in kindergarten. Even if a child attends the Pre K program, they still need to be registered for kindergarten.

Registration is necessary before a student can begin school. It is not nec-

essary for the child to be present at the time of registration. However, the District requires that a parent bring the child's birth certificate, official immunization record of his or her shots and proof of residency (mortgage/lease or utility bill). Any pertinent legal papers should also be provided at this time. According to New York State Law, all children must have a certificate showing complete polio, diphtheria, regular measles, German measles, mumps, varicella and hepatitis B immunizations before entering school.

If the established dates are not convenient, parents may contact Mrs. Norine Miller in the elementary office at 495-4550 to make other arrangements.


