On Friday evening June 24th, we parted ways with the class of 2011 at our 83rd commencement ceremony. This year's class of 31 included 28 students who received Regents diplomas, one (1) local diploma and two (2) IEP diplomas. Six (6) students earned regents diplomas with technical endorsement and one (1) earned a local diploma with technical endorsement. Four (4) Regents diplomas were with distinction, three (3) Regents diplomas were with honors, eight (8) Regents diplomas were with advanced designation, and four (4) diplomas were with distinction.

Also, we recognized Willis Earl Seamon with an Operation Recognition diploma. Operation Recognition is a program providing high school diplomas to the veterans who left school to defend freedom. What started out as only a vision and a promise to honor and thank the veterans who were former high school students who left school to serve our nation in her time of need has become a national program titled "Operation Recognition." "Operation Recognition" honors the individuals who are the true heroes and real patriots of our country.

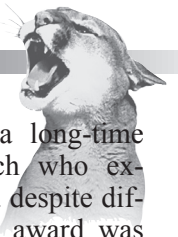

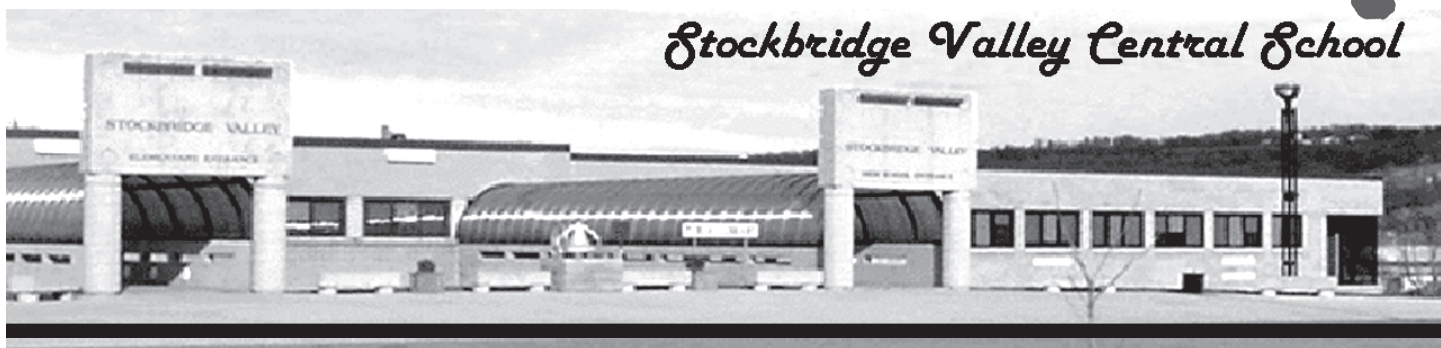
