Dear Bergenfield Elementary School Families:

For most children, summer is a time to relax; they have worked hard during the school year and use this break to recharge for the Fall. However, this time off can cause a dip in academic performance upon their return to school in September. To help avoid the dreaded “summer slide”, we recommend that your child complete the attached optional reading activities in order to keep literacy skills sharp for September. Therefore, we are once again requesting your assistance to help monitor your child’s reading during the months of July and August.

All students entering grades K-5 have the option to chart their reading on a log and play reading BINGO with you. There is no minimum or maximum number of books they should cover, but we encourage your child to read as many as possible. Students entering Kindergarten, first, and second grades should utilize the Summer Reading Bingo Board. Rising third, fourth and fifth graders are encouraged to read **at least two books** over the course of the summer, complete the reading log, and have the option of completing the Summer Writing about Reading Bingo Board for each text. Those who complete these assignments may bring them in to share with their teacher when school starts in September.

All of the materials that you and your child will need are attached, including a leveled book list with suggested titles to help you get started. However, please feel free to explore other “just right” books for your child, using the end of the year reading level on their June report card as a guide. Additionally, the Bergenfield Public Library is a fantastic resource and can help you find these and other titles that may interest your child. Remember, these are optional activities intended to help foster a love for reading.

Estimadas familias de la escuela primaria Bergenfield:

Para la mayoría de los niños, el verano es una época para relajarse; han trabajado duro durante el año escolar y aprovechan este descanso para recargar energías para el otoño. Sin embargo, este tiempo libre puede provocar una baja en el rendimiento académico al regresar a clases en septiembre. Para evitar el temido "descenso de verano", recomendamos que su hijo/a complete las actividades de lectura opcionales adjuntas para mantener sus habilidades de lectoescritura en forma durante septiembre. Por lo tanto, solicitamos nuevamente su ayuda para supervisar la lectura de su hijo/a durante los meses de julio y agosto.

Todos los estudiantes que ingresan a kínder a quinto grado tienen la opción de registrar su lectura en un registro y jugar al bingo de lectura con usted. No hay un número mínimo ni máximo de libros que deban leer, pero animamos a su hijo a leer tantos como sea posible. Los estudiantes que ingresan a kínder, primero y segundo grado deben utilizar el tablero de bingo de lectura de verano. Se anima a los estudiantes que ingresan a tercero, cuarto y quinto grado a leer al menos dos libros durante el verano, completar el registro de lectura y tener la opción de completar el tablero de bingo de escritura de verano sobre lectura para cada texto. Quienes completen estas tareas pueden traerlas para compartirlas con su maestro al inicio de clases en septiembre.

Se adjuntan todos los materiales que usted y su hijo necesitarán, incluyendo una lista de libros por niveles con títulos sugeridos para ayudarles a empezar. Sin embargo, siéntanse libres de explorar otros libros ideales para su hijo, utilizando como guía el nivel de lectura de fin de curso que aparece en su boleta de calificaciones de junio. Además, la Biblioteca Pública de Bergenfield es un recurso fantástico y puede ayudarles a encontrar estos y otros títulos que podrían interesar a su hijo. Recuerden que estas son actividades opcionales diseñadas para fomentar el amor por la lectura.



## Summer Reading: Selecting a “Just Right” Book

Books that are "just right" for your child will be the ones on his or her level. To build fluency, have your child read books on an easier level. Books above your child's level will be too difficult. However, a child's **listening level** is usually 2-3 grade levels above their independent reading level. Therefore, if your child reads at a first grade level, he or she can listen and comprehend books at a third or fourth grade level. Reading aloud to your child will help challenge him or her by introducing sophisticated vocabulary and increasing cognitive skills. In addition, reading together is a great time for parents to bond with their children and will provide opportunities for meaningful discussion. It will become a time you and your child look forward to each night!

As you look through the lists below, please note that the Bergenfield Public Library has many titles, but perhaps not all them. However, if there is something you and your child are interested in that is not currently available in the town library, it can be requested through the BCCLS system. Also, be sure to check in with the Bergenfield Public Library this summer to see the different programs they have available for children of all ages!

Finally, please note that Alpha letters W, X, Y and Z are often reserved for middle school readers and can address more sophisticated topics and themes. Please be sure you are comfortable with the content of these titles, or any other titles, when your child selects a book.
