

EARLY COLLEGE ACADEMY PARTNERSHIP

In addition to the robust College Credit Plus (CCP) Programming available at Hamilton High School, 50 juniors from Hamilton High School and Middletown High School students participated in Miami University's Early College Academy. This innovative partnership allows students to attend classes at Miami University's Regional Campuses and receive dual credit for both high school and college, allowing participating students to graduate with an Associate in Arts degree and their high school diploma simultaneously.

PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Hamilton City School District is a leader in early childhood education by offering tuition-free preschool to our community, including transportation. Our preschool program consistently earns a Five Star Quality Rating (out of five stars!) and prepares our youngest learners for kindergarten readiness.

Highlights

NJROTC

- Being designated as a Distinguished Unit with Academic Honors. The
 highest designation the Navy JROTC program awards, and only the top
 20% of units receive this designation. It signifies excellence across the
 full spectrum of NJROTC activities including community service in
 which we had a 15% avg per cadet increase in service hours resulting in
 over 1000 hours for the unit.
- Outstanding results by all competition teams. Both our Drill and
 Orienteering teams were the overall champions for NJROTC Area 3
 competitions and represented the school and Area 3 at the national
 championship for each event. Our Air Rifle team finished as the 2nd best
 team in school history at the Area 3 competition. Three of our five
 National Academic Teams finished in the top 30% within our Area.
- The first major unit-wide orientation trip since 2019 was conducted in November when 45 cadets plus instructors and chaperones toured the Worlds largest naval base in Norfolk, VA. Visiting aircraft squadrons, warships and a nuclear-powered submarine was an incredible experience for all and gave a better understanding of what makes our military and navy are made of.
- Having four Cadets: Seniors Alexis Smith, Jacob Spangenberg, Tristian Cord and Ray New receive the NJROTC Cadet Achievement Ribbon...the highest award in the U.S. Navy NJROTC program.
- Jacob Spangenberg being awarded a 4-yr NROTC Scholarship to The Ohio State University.
