E. Reports and Discussions

i. Recognition of Service

Chair Meredith Henderson recognized and thanked Scotti Finnegan for her service on the committee. Ms. Finnegan served from 2022-2024.

Chair Meredith Henderson recognized long-time member Terry Russell and thanked him for his commitment to the district. Mr. Russell has served on the Monomoy Regional School Committee since 2011. Mr. Russell shared some words of thanks and then Chair Henderson opened the floor for other committee members to honor Mr. Russell.

ii. Architectural House Doctor Contract

Potential Vote

In a continued conversation from the April 25, 2024 MRSC meeting, Business Manager Michael MacMillan shared more information to support his recommendation to engage the services of an Architectural House Doctor. The district looks to have a pool of pre-qualified designers 'on-call' to assess upcoming projects, increase efficiency in moving projects forward, and with whom we'd develop relationships to remove obstacles and lean on their expertise. After a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was issued earlier in April, the district received responses from seven firms, which was whittled down to three: Habeeb & Associates Architects, Mount Vernon Group Architects, and Raymond Design Associates.

MOTION: Ryan Clarke moved that the district enter into House Architect agreements with the following vendors: Habeeb & Associates Architects, Mount Vernon Group Architects, and Raymond Design Associates. The motion was seconded by Betty Gray.

i. Legislative Liaison Report: MASC Rural Schools

Legislative Liaison Tina Games shared the draft *Statement of Purpose* and *Resolution in Support of Legislation to Improve the fiscal health of rural school districts* of the newly formed MASC Rural Schools Committee. Ms. Games serves on this committee to give voice to schools on the Cape and Islands. Ms. Games continued to speak about anticipated state funding in FY25 (significantly underfunded from previous years) for rural schools and shared a letter template with the committee for them to consider submitting to support fully funding the Rural School Bill.

The committee agreed via general consensus that they will bring the issue back to the full committee once new members have been elected later in May 2024.

ii. Negotiations Subcommittee: Reporting out from Executive Session

On behalf of the Negotiations Subcommittee, Scotti Finnegan reported that the district has agreements with Units A, B and C.

G. Superintendent's Report

i. Recognition of Donations, Grants, and other Acknowledgments

Dr. Carpenter shared the following recognitions:

This week is Teacher Appreciation Week, and we celebrate all of our incredible teachers and staff members. In addition, last Friday was School Lunch Hero Day and Wednesday was School Nurse Day -- many thanks to those important members of our team.

- -At the end of April, MRMS grade 6 students completed their project on The Finest Hours -- they read the book, interviewed community heroes, visited the sites, watched the movie, and then celebrated with their community heroes at a special luncheon, hosted by Wychmere Beach Club. Many thanks to Wychmere and the Orpheum for being the most gracious hosts, to Chatham Perk for providing dessert, and all of the community heroes for participating.
- -In the most recent U.S. News and World Report annual ranking of the best public high schools in each state, Monomoy Regional High School has risen to number 76 of the 351 Massachusetts schools ranked, improving from number 83 in the 2023 analysis, and was one of only five Cape Cod high schools in the top 100.
- -Congratulations to John Dickson, a history and social studies teacher at Monomoy Regional High School, who has been awarded an American Lawyers Alliance Teacher of the Year Award for 2024.
- -The Harwich Elementary Grade 4 Drama Club held performances of Seussical this week congratulations to the student performers and stage crew, along with teachers Ms. Riley, Ms. Hirschberger, Mr. Weimer and the other volunteer supporters for a fantastic production.
- -Tonight is Senior Arts Night, which honors our high school student musicians, performers, and artists at the culmination of their time here in Monomoy. It's a great celebration of their creativity and hard work.
- -Tomorrow, Chatham Elementary will hold its annual Arts Festival, featuring performances and artwork from students throughout the building, with families invited to attend.



How Gardening Helps

Gardening food is a helpful way to help combat climate change for two reasons. The first is the obvious air cleaning that plants perform. They absorb carbon dioxide, and many air pollutants, while releasing clean oxygen. The second is that gardening helps combat the harmful effects of the current food industry. Food systems are responsible for one-quarter of the world's greenhouse gas emissions. This includes emissions from land use change, on-farm production, processing, transport, packaging, and retail. Through the production of our own food, it would be great for Monomoy to play even just a small role in helping this issue.

The environmental impacts of food and agriculture





Overview

I hope to create an educational greenhouse for students at the High School to learn about sustainable nutrition and food systems through hands-on learning. Building on our Nutrition-101 and culinary electives will provide students with adequate knowledge and skills necessary for critical thinking regarding diet and health so they can make healthy food choices from an increasingly complex food supply. I hope to introduce the planting and harvesting of crops in a school greenhouse to students. Ultimately, these foods will either be available for lunch at the school cafeteria, could be given to low-income students to use at home, or sold at local farmers markets.

Successful Example

Nauset Middle School



The Nauset middle school built their very own greenhouse in 2015. They use it to grow fruits, vegetables, and flowers which are sold at local farmers markets. Students have access to the greenhouse and it is also used by the community year-round. It cost \$84,000 for the structure itself and \$125,000 total.

- Special Education students come in to work on projects
- Science classes use it for learn about different energy sources and how they work in the greenhouse as well as conduct research
- Math students measure plant growth over time, graph their results, and determine if there is or is not a constant rate of growth
- Art students come in to draw plants and flowers, and make pots for the plants to be sold
- Even foreign language classes have used the greenhouse to teach students the terms of various plants

How to found the project
