Weekly Progress Expectations

Students are required to work a minimum of 6 hours a day of online and offline activity. Students are required to complete and electronically submit an offline activity log weekly if applicable. Please contact Julie Falcon if you need the link. Minimum of **7% per course per week** for students with an entire semester to complete courses. Overall progress of 7% per course is considered on track to finish the semester class. **If a student does not finish the class (100% complete), the student will receive a zero for all unfinished assignments or assessments.** Each time this minimum weekly progress is NOT met, the student will need additional weekly percentage in order to complete courses by their semester deadline.

Parent/Guardian's Ability to Check Progress

Accelerate Education observer account allows a learning coach to view their child's progress per day and will send weekly progress updates to their email address. This report includes:

- Course Title
- Teacher Name
- Current Grade in the Course
- Current Progress for the student
- Progress tracking
- Course End Date
- Student's Last Login

Student Accountability

1. Courtesy Call about progress concerns to the Learning Coach.
2. Students not meeting the weekly progress expectations will have a student improvement meeting.
 - The students & a parent or guardian must schedule a PLAN OF IMPROVEMENT meeting with the Virtual School Team at which the student will present his/her:
 - Plan of Improvement - changes the student will implement to be successful
 - Daily Schedule - hourly schedule showing time commitment to each course
2. Students who do not follow the Plan of Improvement will be subject to dismissal from the virtual setting.

Attendance Policy

Attendance is verified through Accelerate Education Attendance Log, progress reports, submission of assignments, and offline activity logs. Simply logging in is not attending. Progress will be checked each Monday for the previous week. Any student not showing 6 hours of daily work, whether online or through the Offline Learning Log, will be counted absent on the corresponding day(s) of non-participation.

Individual Plans of Study - Grades 7-12

What is an Individual Plan of Study (IPS)?

As students navigate through middle and high school, it is important they set educational goals and create a roadmap for success. This roadmap includes the development of a flexible career focus and an educational plan that is clearly defined and relevant to assure a successful transition to post secondary education and/or the workforce.

What are the elements of an IPS?

The foundational elements of the Individual Plan of Study are the career interests identified by the student through a Career Interest Survey and other activities using Xello. A roadmap based on the student interests and talents can then be developed. Other parts of the IPS include graduation requirements, approved coursework for the student's educational and career goals and developmentally appropriate, work-based learning experiences. Individual plans of study will be completed individually and scheduled via in-person or by web conference.
