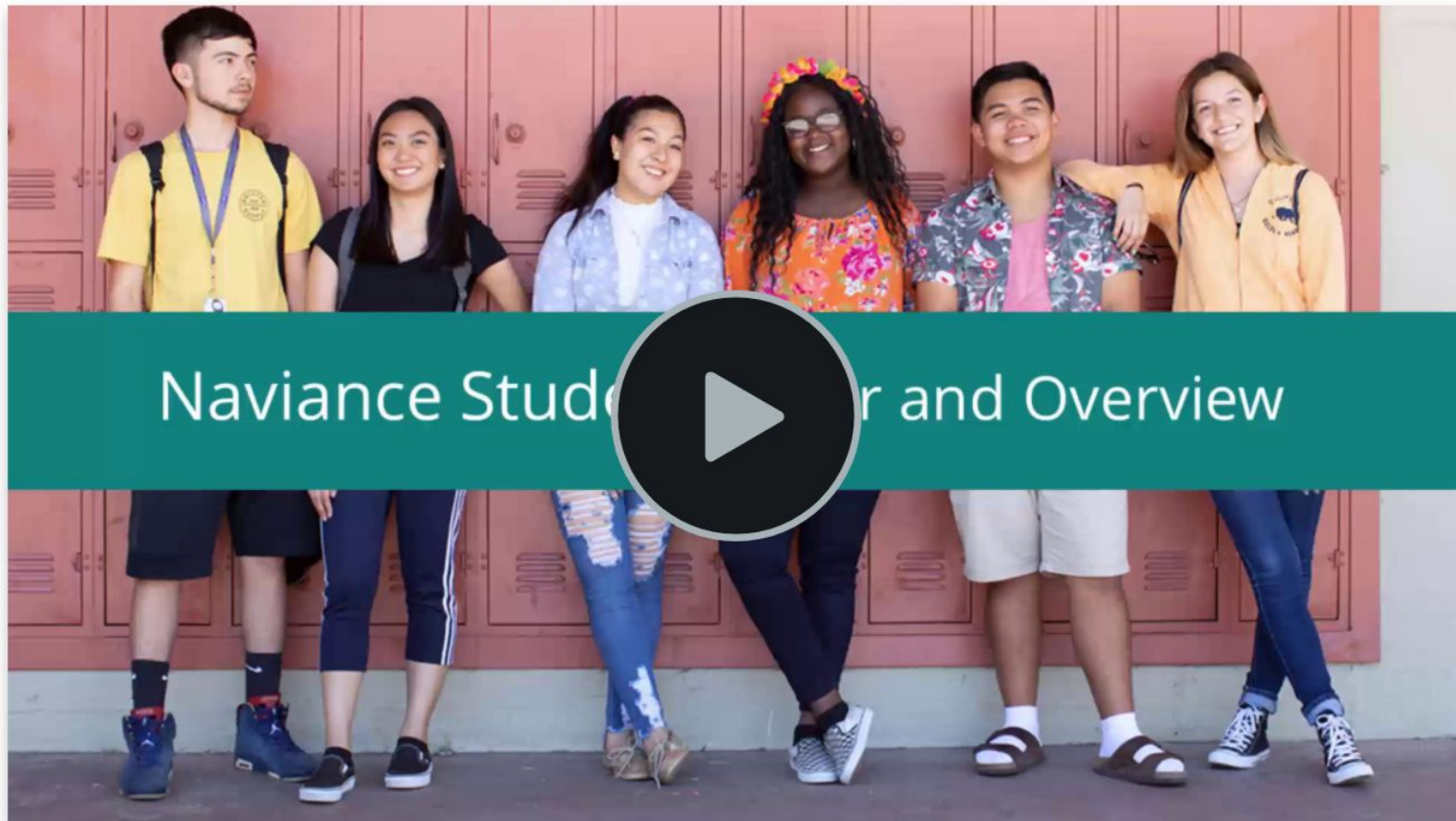

2. COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS-ACT/SAT

- ✓ Can take multiple times
- ✓ October tests may not meet scholarship deadlines (check deadlines)
- ✓ Some colleges superscore
- ✓ Some schools are test optional
- ✓ Use your 4 free schools to send scores when registering



2. COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS-ACT/SAT

- ❑ ACT STATE TEST – March ALL Juniors – FREE
 - Link with National online account with ACT ID number provided on score report sheet if needed
- ❑ ACT NATIONAL TEST – on Saturdays – student pays
 - Fee waivers available for financial disadvantaged – see your Counselor
 - Register online at www.actstudent.org and www.collegeboard.org/register



2. COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS-ACT/SAT

- ACT/SAT “Unofficial” Scores on HS Transcript.
- Some colleges want “Official” Scores sent directly from ACT/SAT, always check.
- Use Free Score reports to colleges when registering!

Between Now and September

- Create “Colleges I am interested in” list in Naviance
- Explore college websites
- Start a list of awards and activities/resume
- Start writing essays
- Think about who can write recommendations if needed
- Review your transcript (when we return to school)

- Strong Senior Years



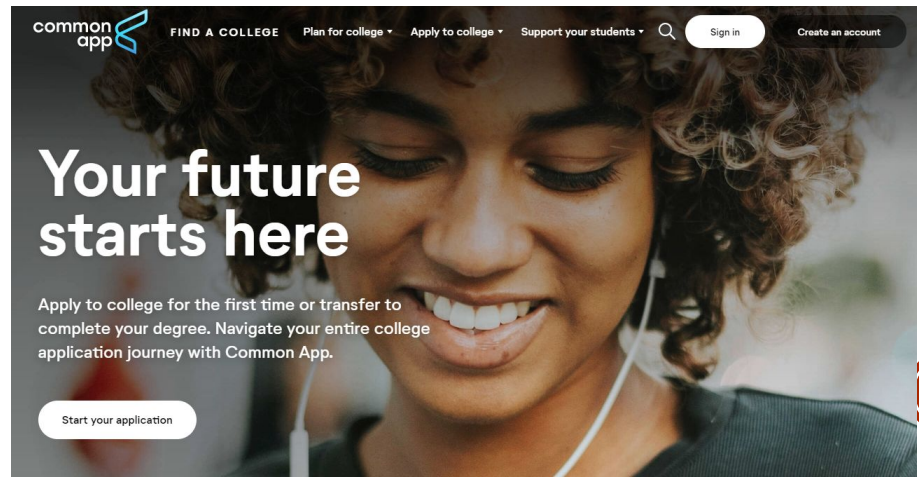
5. PREPARE FOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

College Applications –

- Done electronically through:
 1. Institutional App
 2. Common App

COMMON APPLICATION

- Opens August 1st
- Will need to be matched with Naviance to send transcripts and letters of recommendations
- Wait until our SENIOR COLLEGE APPLICATION MEETING TO START. If you cannot wait, DO NOT REQUEST ANY TRANSCRIPTS OR LETTERS OF REC until our meeting
