This city utilizes 100% renewable, geothermal energy by utilizing steam from geothermal sources to generate electricity with surplus steam used for industrial processes and heating, hydrogen generation through electrolysis of water, for vehicle transportation and excess electrical power for exporting to other countries.

### Comments

Board Member Steve Corona congratulated Rohli Booker on being named to City Council.
