

# Summer Reading/Work

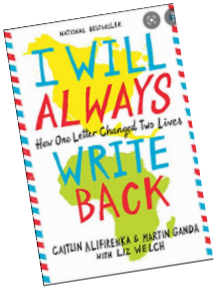
The summer read is based on grade level.

by Caitlin Alifirenka, Liz Welsh, and Martin Ganda

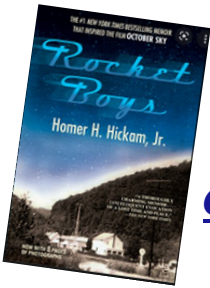


Sophomore - *The Silver Sword* (also titled *Escape from Warsaw*)

by Ian Serraillier

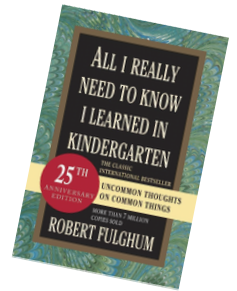


Junior - *Rocket Boys* by Homer Hickam
