BALLOT FOR ELECTION TO BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

There are **TWO** vacancies on the Board of Cooperative Educational Services to be filled at the annual election to be held on **April 16, 2024**. The terms for these vacancies are July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2027. The trustees or board of education of each component school district may, by resolution, cast one vote for each vacancy to be filled, provided that no more than one vote be cast for any candidate. No more than one person residing in a particular component school district may be elected to serve on the Board of Cooperative Educational Services at one time, except as provided in Education Law, Section 1950(2-a).

The district clerk, or other officer authorized to certify that a board resolution has been adopted, shall complete the ballot by placing an "X" next to the name of each candidate for whom a vote has been cast, and by completing the certification on the next page. Candidates are listed with their address and school district of residence.
