PLACEMENT REPORT 2022

The facts and figures in this Placement Report are provided to present the post high school status of each Sweet Home graduating class. The data which follows is gathered through a Senior Survey conducted during the spring and summer of each school year.

In 2022 **223** seniors responded to the survey which is **100%** of the graduating class. Of those who responded, approximately **75.34%** indicated they would be attending a post secondary institution with **19.28%** of the class indicating they were employed in part or full-time jobs. Those entering the military service is approximately **.90%** of the graduating class.

Of the **168** seniors who indicated they would attend post secondary institutions, **88.10%** will remain in New York State with **67.57%** remaining in Erie County, **12.84%** going to Niagara County, and the remaining **19.59%** traveling across New York State. Of those graduates attending institutions in New York State, **64.19%** will be attending 4 year colleges, **35.81%** two year colleges and **0.00%** attending a Business, Trade or Technical School. Those students will be represented at **27** different institutions.

Approximately **11.90%** (20) of those furthering their education will be traveling outside of New York State and will represent Sweet Home in **10** states and **17** different institutions. **20** students will attend a 4 year college, **0** students will attend a 2 year college, and **0** will attend a Technical School.

COMMUNITY: The school is located north of Buffalo and south of Niagara Falls in a suburban community with the State University of New York at Buffalo as its neighbor. The district serves a sociologically diverse community of approximately 40,000.

ACCREDITATION: Sweet Home High School is approved and accredited by the Board of Regents of the State University of New York as a four year secondary school.

SCHOOL YEAR: A 40-week school year, September - June is based on two semesters with four ten-week marking periods.

Regents Diploma - The core requirements above **plus** successful completion of Regents examinations in Mathematics, English, Global Studies, U.S. History, and Science.

Regents Advanced Endorsement - The core requirements **plus** a 3 unit sequence in the same Foreign Language **plus** successful completion of Algebra, Geometry, and Alg2/Trig Regents exams, 2 Science Regents exams, Comprehensive English exam, U.S. History and Global Regents exams. If a student has a 5 unit sequence in art, music, technology, business, or career/technical education, this may be in place of the 3 year Foreign Language requirement.

CREDIT, GRADING AND RANKING - A full year, one credit course meets for approximately 40 minutes per day, five days per week. Credit is awarded when the final grade is 65 or higher. A final grade is determined using the formula 4/5 for class work and 1/5 for the final examination. New York State Regents credits are earned by achieving a grade of 65 or higher on any Regents examination and successful completion of the course. The passing grade for all courses is 65 with a maximum unweighted grade of 100. Weighting is used to determine the grade point average at the end of each marking period and at the end of the year. The actual unweighted grade for each course appears on the report card or transcript and the average of all courses reflects the weighting factor as follows:

Class Rank is computed at the end of the Junior year and is determined by the grades for the total number of credits earned, multiplied by the course weighting factor and divided by the total number of credits attempted.

Advanced Placement Examinations 2021 - 2022: A total of 220 students completed 311 examinations in 13 different areas. There were 195 (63%) examinations with scores of 3 or higher.
