LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have enjoyed their new story 'Diary of a Killer Cat.' The children have been learning about the features of a diary entry and have been discussing the characters in the story. In PE, the children enjoyed an Athletics lesson from Coach Katie. They have been learning about the difference between jogging, running and sprinting. In Maths the children are learning their numbers from 50-100 and have been partitioning these numbers and putting them on a numberline.

Ask me: What is the character of Tuffy like?



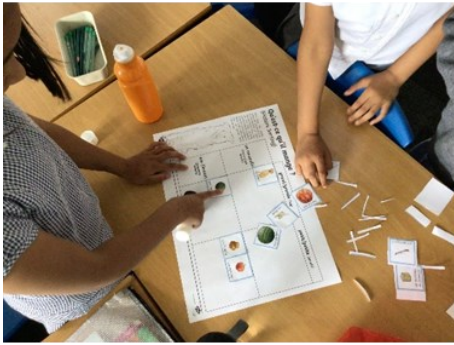
It has been lovely to welcome **Year 2** back this week. In maths, we have started our new topic of 'Statistics' and we have been focussing on tallies and tally charts. In literacy, we have been reading a modern version of 'Rapunzel' and making predictions and producing setting descriptions. In history, we have started learning about Queen Elizabeth I.

Ask me: What is a mechanism?



Year 3 were thrilled to resume school this half-term! In English, we wrote a persuasive letter to a character from our class novel 'The Great Kapok Tree'. As young mathematicians, we continued our unit on 'Time' understanding of when to use different units of time and draw upon the different strategies to solve each problem. Year 3 have been incredibly respectful and mature as we have started our Jigsaw unit on 'Changing Me', exploring how there are lots of changes of the human body as we grow up.

Ask me: What was your favourite activity this week? How was the invasion of Scotland similar to or different from what happened in England and Wales?



In **Year 4** this week the children completed their 'Changing Me' topic, asking sensible questions and sharing their thoughts and ideas. I was incredibly impressed with the behaviour of all the Year 4 children during these sessions. In PE the children had their 'Healthy Me' session with the Sports Partnership as well as a baseball lesson. With the Government timetables check coming up, the children have been working hard to improve their timetables speed and accuracy. In other Maths lessons, the children have been learning about angles and shape.

Ask me: What is a polygon?



Reception have had a very busy week starting their new project On the Beach! We started this week by creating a makeshift beach on the playground where the children got to splash around in the 'sea', bury their feet and dig for shells. We talked about the various things you could do at the beach and the children were keen to share their own experiences at beaches. We have been thinking hard about keeping our beaches clean to help the wildlife that lives there. We also had the opportunity to take part in the Reception Multi Skills Festival where the children were able to participate in different games throughout the morning. They worked hard in their teams and showed real determination!

Ask me: why is it important to keep our beaches clean?

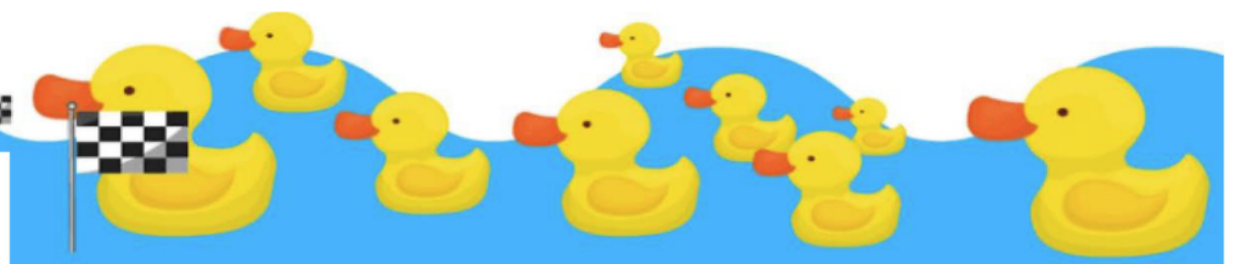
