Collegiate Institute / Dual Credit

Collegiate Institute

- Collegiate Institute= The Collegiate Institute is a tracked program that allows high school students to enroll in college credit courses with the end goal being an Associate's Degree IF plan is followed.
- College credits are earned through Dallas College with 16 out 20 classes taught by Bishop Dunne teachers on Bishop Dunne's campus.
- Please understand not all college credit transfers to all colleges
- In order to avoid setbacks, students must: Provide Dallas College ID, pass the TSI test through Dallas College, follow the required classes including the summer courses (BD will enroll students in classes), and students must provide transcripts to BD for proof of completed classes.

- If Associate's Degree is not earned, student still has college credit that may transfer to schools.

Associate's Degree Track

- Associate's Degree Track: Students can earn an Associate's Degree with Dallas College. Students will need to pass an English AND Math TSIA2 exam with Dallas College for all English, Social Studies, and Math classes in addition to completing four extra online classes with Dallas College using Dallas College professors. It is best if the student signs up before their Freshmen year under the Collegiate Institute page on Bishop Dunne's website
- Students will earn 60-65 college credit hours

Non-Associate's Degree Track

- Non-Associate's Degree Track: Students can earn college credit with Dallas College. Students will need to pass an English AND Math TSIA2 exam with Dallas College for all English, Social Studies, and Math classes. An Associate's Degree will not be earned, but a student can earn as many college credits as possible to transfer into a four-year university/college. A student can sign up at any time with the understanding an Associate's Degree will not be earned.
- Students can earn up to 57 college credit hours

Beginning Steps

- 1. Student applies for Dallas College as a new Dual Credit Student
- 2. Wait 5-7 days for the student to receive their Dallas College ID#
- 3. Complete the <u>Forms</u> document to identify if the student will go towards the Associate's Degree Track or the Non-Associate's Degree Track as well as inputting their Dallas College ID#.
- 4. The Dual Credit coordinator will begin the process of enrolling the student into Dual Credit classes.

- Once ID# is received, the Director of Guidance can begin the process of enrolling student in Dual Credit classes.

Enrolling

- If classes are on Bishop Dunne's campus, the dual credit coordinator will enroll students based on Bishop Dunne's course selections.
- Any Dallas College classes taken online, an Operoo will be sent out in October (for Spring) and March (for Summer & Fall).
- Students (and parents) verify which classes they want based on grade/academic level.
- The Dual Credit Coordinator will enroll the students into the requested courses.
- Request may not remain based on: TSI scores, scheduling, unknown Dallas College ID, and availability.

Dallas College Online Classes

- A Master's degree is required in the content for a Bishop Dunne teacher to be qualified according to Dallas College.
- SPAN1411, ENVI1401, ENVI1402, and GOVT2306 are all required classes—for an Associate's degree—that will be online.
- It could be 8-weeks or 16-weeks during the school year or during the summer
- Students will need to sign into their <u>eCampus</u> to complete assignments
- BD has no juris diction over Dallas College online classes and professors

TSIA2 Exams





What is it?

- TSIA2 is a state-legislated assessment to determine your basic skills in reading, mathematics and writing.
- If you do not take it through Dallas College with the dual credit opportunity, most Texas 4-year universities/colleges require the assessment.
- This is only for Dallas College and their credit for college. This exam has no bearing on your high school credit.

Steps to taking the TSIA2

- 1. Practice using some free material <u>HERE</u>
- Complete the Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA). This needs to be completed twodays before your test.
- 3. Complete the TSIA2 test <u>referral</u>. This referral is already signed by your success coach, Mr. Fred. Bring with you on testing day.
- Take the TSIA2. Hours of operations and contact information can be found <u>HERE</u>. You will also need your Dallas College ID.
- 5. Students should complete the <u>FORM</u> to upload their passing score. Student needs their Bishop Dunne login to open and complete form.

Steps for Group Testing

- 1. Practice using some free material <u>HERE</u>
- Complete the Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA). This needs to be completed twodays before your test. Students cannot travel to test without this complete.
- 3. Complete the TSIA2 test <u>referral</u>. This referral is already signed by your success coach, Mr. Fred. Bring with you on testing day.
- 4. Bishop Dunne students will test at Mountain View in April. Freshmen will take the English exam and students currently enrolled in Algebra II will test in Math. Dallas College ID is needed. Freshmen will receive their Dallas ID the day of their exam.
- 5. Scores will be delivered to the dual credit coordinator at Bishop Dunne.

What if...?

- What if I do not pass?
 - Follow the steps to take the test again
 - You have unlimited chances, but only the first test is free...every retest is \$10.
 - Or, do well on the PSAT NMSQT in October for 10th and 11th graders.

Dallas College Success Coach

- Mr. Fred Osei-Frimpong is the success coach for all students earning Dallas College credit.
- Located at the Cedar Valley campus.
- He has access to student's progress and helps bridge the gap between student and Dallas College professors.

- Can students enroll in an AP class AND Dual Credit? Yes. Students can earn the GPA boost of an AP class as well as earn guaranteed college credit whether they pass the AP exam or not.
- Why are some Dual Credit classes online and not on Bishop Dunne campus? A Bishop Dunne teacher Master's Degree is not in the subject matter OR our teacher's class load is full.
- Who is the contact person at Dallas College? Mr. Fred Osei-Frimpong is the success coach. He visits Bishop Dunne's campus 3-4 times per semester to guide students and make sure they are on track.

FAQs

- What does Bishop Dunne actually do? Bishop Dunne's Dual Credit coordinator enroll students in the Dallas College classes and provides an opportunity for students to complete their TSI test before their sophomore year and before they enroll into Pre-Cal.
- Bishop Dunne does not do what? Bishop Dunne does not provide tutoring for TSI, travel for extra TSI attempts, and we cannot view students' Dallas College progress.
- What is the student's main expectations? Students should check their Dallas College eCampus to confirm they are enrolled in classes. They should pass the enrolled classes and advocate for themselves as this is a college experience. And please check their emails...Dallas College and Bishop Dunne email.

FAQs (continued)

- If a student enrolls into an online class, can Bishop Dunne help? At a teacher's discretion, they may help but are not required. Bishop Dunne also cannot contact the Dallas College professor; it is the responsibility of the student as it is a college class.
- What if the student wants to drop from a class? Student needs to contact the Dual Credit coordinator before the drop deadline. There is a six-drop limit for the program
- How do I know if my student is in Dual Credit classes? Students should check their eCampus and their Advisory Report on eConnect to confirm their classes.
- Is there a minimum or maximum amount of college credit students can earn. There is no minimum; if a student only wants to take English classes, they can only enroll in those classes (if TSI is passed). Maximum is no more than 65 to avoid scholarship issues.
