When he gets a chance to win a million dollars if he can complete a pass during the halftime of a New England Patriots game, he is nearly overwhelmed by the pressure to succeed.

Then a mysterious note arrives. The notes keep coming, and Miranda realizes that whoever is leaving them knows things no one should know.

Forced to reveal her condition, she must look to herself to develop an understanding and appreciation of her gift.	
Test of restricts	Out of my Mind by Sharon Draper <b>700L</b> Considered by many to have a cognitive disability, a brilliant, impatient fifth-grader with cerebral palsy is trapped inside her body, determined to make a mark in the world in spite of her physical limitations.	

ellen-potter	Slob by Ellen Potter <b>740L</b> Twelve year old Owen is the fattest kid in school. But he's also a genius who invents cool contraptions. But genius or not, there is much Owen can't out-think. Like his gym coach, who's on a mission to humiliate him. Or the way his Oreos keep disappearing from his lunch. No matter how large he is on the outside, he doesn't have to feel small on the inside.
touchblue	Touch Blue by Cynthia Lord <b>750L</b> The state of Maine plans to shut down her island's schoolhouse, which would force Tess's family to move to the mainlandand Tess to leave the only home she has ever known. Fortunately, the islanders have a plan: increase the numbers of students by having families take in foster children. Now Tess and her family are taking a chance on Aaron, a thirteen-year-old trumpet player who has been bounced from home to home. Will Tess's luck run out?
NOT DER STRUCK	Wonderstruck by Brian Selznick <b>830L</b> Ben and Rose secretly wish their lives were different. Ben longs for the father he has never known. Rose dreams of a mysterious actress whose life she chronicles in a scrapbook. When Ben discovers a puzzling clue in his mother's room and Rose reads an enticing headline in the newspaper, both children set out alone on desperate quests to find what they are missing.
EISA GREENWALD	My Life in Pink and Green by Lisa Greenwald <b>680L</b> Twelve-year-old Lucy Desberg is a natural problem-solver. At her family's struggling pharmacy, she has a line of makeover customers for every school dance. But all the makeup tips in the world won't help save the business. If only she could find a way to make it the center of town again—a place where people want to spend time, like in the old days. Lucy dreams up a solution that could save the family business. But will Lucy's family stop fighting long enough to listen?

In fact, it seems to her that's what they do every Jewish holiday. 
CRISPIN VIE OBE OT IN VOLA AVI	<u>Crispin: At the Edge of the World</u> by Avi <b>730L</b> In this sequel to <i>Crispin: The Cross of Lead,</i> Crispin and Bear have set off to live as free men. But they don't get far before their past catches up with them. When Bear is badly wounded, it is up to Crispin to save them. To find freedom and safety, they may have to travel to the edge of the world—even if it means confronting death itself.
GARY PAULSEN WOODS RUNNER	Woods Runner by Gary Paulsen <b>870L</b> In 1776, 13-year-old Samuel returns home from hunting in the woods to find his settlement burned and most of the settlers missing.
A DEMINE Market	<u>Code Talker</u> by Joseph Bruchac <b>910L</b> Throughout World War II, Navajo code talkers were a crucial part of the U.S. effort, sending messages back and forth in an unbreakable code that used their native language. They braved some of the heaviest fighting of the war, and they saved countless American lives. Joseph Bruchac brings their stories to life through the fictional tale of Ned, a sixteen-year-old Navajo boy who becomes a code talker.
