For the 2021/2022 Academic year, the A4 office has expanded programs now serving students K-8 in the summer. This expansion will serve students across all regions and grade levels that did not previously have access to support provided by our office. Utilizing this support model, the A4 office in collaboration with ELF/Inter-Act Fellows is intended to maintain the level of rigorous and explicit instruction meeting the needs of each student served. ELF/Inter-Act Fellows will provide services within A4's Summer Math Camp, Springboard Summer Reading Program and the launch of middle schools L.E.A.D. program. The 10 instructional tutors will provide a total of 84 hours of in class instructional support and participate in 5 hours of professional development to prepare for programs. 

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Included in the Board binders is agreement with the University of Colorado-National P3 Center. The ultimate goal of the University of Colorado-National P-3 Center is to improve the education continuum that children experience from birth (preschool) through 3rd grade. P-3 signifies both an age range and a lens for thinking about organization and system level change which requires intentional planning, formally designed strategies, and explicit leadership and support. As Fresno Unified expands early learning programs, we will utilize the services of the National P-3 Center to conduct an FUSD District P-3 Audit to determine the extent to which current district structures, practices, and policies are systemically aligned to support the education continuum preschool through 3rd grade. The National P-3 Center will partner with FUSD in using the P-3 Framework to provide evidence-based guidance for district leaders in planning capacity-building efforts and support in prioritizing and planning next steps in P-3 efforts. The P-3 Framework is divided into 8 major "buckets" or categories of effort that have been identified as essential to high-quality and comprehensive P-3 approaches. Evidence indicates that the more buckets that are implemented well, the more likely that benefits will occur, for example, improved quality of learning experiences for young children and, in turn, improved child outcomes. The duration of the contract is for 12 months.

By granting access to Confidential Information, the District does not grant any express or implied right to Contractor to use, publish or disclose any Confidential Information. After its review of the Confidential Information Contractor will return to the District all Confidential Information disclosed to it (including copies or summaries of Confidential Information), or with the District's permission destroy the Confidential Information and certify in writing that it has been destroyed.
- 14. <u>Injunctive Relief</u>. Each Party acknowledges that a breach or threatened breach of this Agreement may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the District and that, to protect against such harm, the District may seek from a court of competent jurisdiction the issuance of a restraining order or injunction to prohibit any threatened disclosure.

- or misuse of the District's Confidential Information. Such an action for a restraining order or injunction is in addition to and does not limit all other remedies provided by law or in equity or by agreement between the Parties.
- 15. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold District, its agents, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees, officials, officers, volunteers, and representatives ("Indemnitees") free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, negligence (including the active or passive negligence of Indemnitees, regardless of whether sole or otherwise, as allowed by law), causes of action, costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages or injuries, fines, penaltics in law or equity, regardless of whether the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively "Loss") to the extent arising out of or incident to: 1) the performance or breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract (including but not limited to) the Contractor's use of the site; or 2) any acts, omissions, negligence, in connection with the performance of Services or otherwise arising from this Contract ("Indemnification"); or 3) the willful misconduct of the Contractor or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees. The Contractor's Indemnification includes, but is not limited to, the payment of all damages and attorney's fees, fines, penalties and other related costs and expenses.
 - a. The Contractor's defense obligations (with counsel approved by District), shall arise immediately upon tender of any of the Indemnitees, and the defense shall be paid at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, for any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against any of the Indemnitees, notwithstanding whether liability is, can be or has yet been established.
 - b. The Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against any of the Indemnitees, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding. The Contractor shall reimburse Indemnitees, and each of them, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.
 - c. Acceptance of insurance certificates and endorsements required under the contract does not relieve the Contractor from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. In the event that "Contractor's" Commercial General liability policy excludes coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims shall be required to procure a separate or supplemental policy providing such coverage. The limits of coverage for the abuse and molestation policy shall be not less than \$1,000,000 per claim and \$3,000,000 aggregate. If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis then the following shall apply; 1) The retroactive date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work; 2) Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work; (3) If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a retroactive date prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of work. Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by District. The District may require "Contractor" to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses within the retention. The policy shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or the District.

The District shall be named as an additional insured on the policies by separate endorsement. A Certificate of Insurance and endorsements shall be attached to the Agreement as proof of insurance. The "Contractor" policy shall provide that it is primary such that insurance maintained by the District, if any, shall be excess and not co-primary. "Contractor" shall produce the policy for District, upon request.

Contractor will not begin work on the Project site until obtaining a DOJ cleared status through the DISTRICT. Contractor further acknowledges that other fingerprinting requirements may apply, as set forth in Education Code Section 45125 et seq., and will comply with any such requirements, including having Consultant certifies Consultants certify that none of these employees and/or affiliated constituent(s) will have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1. "Fingerprinting Requirements," is expressly understood and agreed to by the parties hereto:

- Severability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent
 jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
- 24. Waiver and Amendments. This Agreement may be amended, modified, superseded, cancelled, renewed or extended, and the terms and conditions hereof may be waived, only by a written instrument signed by the parties or, in the case of a waiver, by the party waiving compliance. The waiver by any party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- 25. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California and venue shall be in the appropriate Superior court in Fresno, California.
- 26. Attorney's Fees. The non-prevailing party in any dispute under this Agreement shall pay all costs and expenses, including expert witness fees and attorney's fees, incurred by the prevailing party in resolving such dispute.

27. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the company or to an officer of the corporation for whom it was intended, or if delivered to or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the person who gives the notice.

CONTRACT BETWEEN FRESNO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

AND

CORE DISTRICTS ("CORE")

This Agreement is made as of June 1, 2022 by and between the Fresno Unified School District ("District") and CORE Districts ("CORE") for the purpose of accessing the shared services of Lynn Rocha Salazar ("Employee"), an employee of the District, as follows:

WHEREAS, CORE desires that Employee provide the shared services as set out herein, and the District wishes to have Employee render such shared services to CORE; and

WHEREAS, to the extent Employee provides services to CORE throughout the term of this Agreement, Employee shall remain an employee of the District on loan to CORE.

THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work:

The District shall require the Employee to perform for CORE the services as described in Exhibit "A, Scope of Work," which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Services").

2. Term of Agreement:

The period of the performance of this Agreement is from August 1, 2022 through June 28, 2023, unless terminated under another provision of this Agreement, or otherwise by law.

3. District Obligations:

- 3.1 To the extent reasonable under the circumstances of this Agreement, the District will direct that Employee fulfill the following obligations to CORE:
 - a. Carry out the Services with due diligence, care, and efficiency in a manner so as to promote the purpose of this Agreement and shall in all professional matters contemplated by this Agreement, act as a faithful advisor to CORE.
 - b. Conform in all respects with provisions of the applicable regulations, laws and ordinances of any jurisdictional authority in the area where the Services are to be

performed.

- c. Refrain, during the term of this Agreement, from engaging in any activity, whether political or of any other nature, which may adversely affect, impede or impair the performance of the Services.
- 3.2 The District shall provide Employee a compensation package comprised of salary, health benefits, and payments to the State Teachers Retirement System ("STRS") in accordance with the "CORE Budget and Compensation Schedule" set forth in Exhibit "B," attached hereto and incorporated herein, and shall place the Employee on the District Management Salary Schedule, as determined by the District. Actual compensation may be prorated to reflect the period of performance, as appropriate.

4. CORE Payments:

- 4.1 CORE shall pay the District for Services performed by Employee hereunder, and as specified in Exhibit B, "CORE Budget and Compensation Schedule." CORE agrees to, and shall, reimburse the District for each and every item of compensation to Employee incurred by and through this Agreement. CORE acknowledges and agrees that it shall pay any increases in compensation to Employee related to COLA adjustments, or other District action, that apply during the term of this Agreement. CORE further agrees to pay the District all reasonable costs that may arise from, or are related to, the termination of Employee's District employment, regardless of the reason for said termination.
- 4.2 The District will provide CORE with itemized invoices on a monthly basis. CORE shall pay the District on a monthly basis upon receipt of an itemized invoice from the District. Invoices should be sent by the District to CORE's Director of Operations via email at **Brenda@coredistricts.org**. The District shall continue to disburse Lynn Rocha Salazar's compensation payments from the commencement of this Agreement through June 30, 2022, in accordance with Employee's payroll schedule.
- 4.3 In the event that CORE's obligation to pay the District becomes delinquent by more than sixty (60) days, the District may, at its option, deem CORE to be in default and terminate this Agreement at the conclusion of the then-current school year, or in accordance with Section 8, below. In the event the District incurs costs related to the termination of Employee

arising from, or related to, the cancellation of this Agreement, the obligations set forth in Section 4.1, above, shall survive any such cancellation/termination of this Agreement and remain in full force and effect.

4.4 Should Employee incur incidental expenses, such expenses shall be paid directly by CORE upon presentation of receipts evidencing said expenses to CORE by Employee. The District shall have no responsibility whatsoever to reimburse Employee for incidental expenses.

5. **Governing Law**:

This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of California. In the event of a dispute between the parties, such dispute shall be resolved according to California Law, with venue in Fresno County, California.

6. **Assignment**:

No part of this Agreement shall be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other party, and any attempted assignment without such consent shall be null and void.

7. Amendment:

No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by both parties, and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the parties.

8. **Termination**:

In addition to the grounds for termination stated in Section 4.3, above, the District may cancel this Agreement at any time and for any reason by giving CORE at least thirty (30) days advance written notice. Should this Agreement be cancelled or terminated during its term, CORE shall make reasonable efforts to enable Employee to undertake and/or resume her District duties and functions.

9. **Indemnification**:

The District agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CORE, its officers, employees, agents and representatives from all claims, liabilities, losses by whomsoever asserted arising out of acts or

omissions by the District, its employees (other than the Employee herein, for whom CORE shall

remain liable), agents and representatives in the performance of this Agreement, except those

arising by reason of the negligence of CORE, its officers, employees, agents or representatives.

CORE agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the District, its Governing Board of Trustees and each

of them, its officers, employees, agents and representatives from all claims, liabilities, losses by

whomsoever asserted arising out of acts or omissions by CORE, its employees, the Employee herein,

its agents or representatives in the performance of this Agreement, except those arising by reason

of the negligence of the District, its officers, employees, agents or representatives.

Notwithstanding the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason (a) any provision of this Agreement that imposes or contemplates continuing obligations on a Party shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including without limitation, the rights and duties under Paragraphs 12, 13, 15, and 17; and (b) all undisputed fees due and payable hereunder through the termination date in accordance with Paragraphs 4 and 5.

13. Confidential Information

- a. For the purposes of this Agreement "Confidential Information" includes any written or oral information or data, disclosed by either Party to the other, which may include, without limitation, information relating to technical, financial, personnel, personal employee information, the network, corporate, administration, plan design, benefits or contractual affairs of either Party or a third party that has been identified as confidential or that by the nature of the circumstances surrounding disclosure ought reasonably to be treated as confidential.
- b. Contractor hereby agrees that it shall not disclose Confidential Information, and any materials, discussions, or other communications concerning Confidential Information to any person or entity, except to its own employees, contractor personnel, and to its attorneys, accountants, consultants and other professional advisors having a "need to know," and who are themselves bound by similar nondisclosure restrictions (collectively, "Representatives"). If Contractor becomes aware of any disclosure or use not in compliance with this Agreement, Contractor shall notify the District in writing within three (3) business days. Contractor shall use at least the same degree of care in safeguarding Confidential Information as it uses in safeguarding its own confidential information. Representatives shall be bound to comply with all terms of this Paragraph
 - 13.B. Upon the request of the District, Contractor shall provide a written acknowledgment from each of its Representatives that said Representative is bound by the terms of this Paragraph 13.B.
- c. Contractor's obligation under this Agreement to not disclose Confidential Information shall not apply to information that: (a) becomes generally available to the public other than as the result of unauthorized disclosure by Contractor or a third party; (b) is independently developed by Contractor without the aid, application or use of Confidential Information; or (c) was received by Contractor on a non-confidential basis prior to receipt from the District or from a third-party lawfully possessing and lawfully entitled to disclose such information.
- d Disclosure of Confidential Information shall not be precluded if such disclosure is: (a) required pursuant to a valid court order; or (b) in the opinion of legal counsel for Contractor, is otherwise required by law, provided that in either circumstance:
 - Contractor shall furnish the District with a copy of the demand, summons, subpoena or other legal process to compel such disclosure;
 - Contractor shall give the District reasonable prior notice of its intention to disclose Confidential Information in order to allow the District an opportunity to seek appropriate protection; and
 - Contractor shall take all reasonable steps including, without limitation, the pursuit of a protective order, to restrict the disclosure of Confidential Information to the greatest extent possible.
- e. All Confidential Information provided by the District to Contractor is and shall forever remain the sole and exclusive property of the District. By granting access to Confidential Information, the District does not grant any express or implied right to Contractor to use, publish or disclose any Confidential Information. After its review of the Confidential Information Contractor will return to the District all Confidential Information disclosed to it (including copies or summaries of Confidential Information), or with the District's permission destroy the Confidential Information and certify in writing that it has been destroyed.
- 14. Injunctive Relief. Each Party acknowledges that a breach or threatened breach of this Agreement may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the District and that, to protect against such harm, the District may seek from a court of competent jurisdiction the issuance of a restraining order or injunction to prohibit any threatened disclosure

- or misuse of the District's Confidential Information. Such an action for a restraining order or injunction is in addition to and does not limit all other remedies provided by law or in equity or by agreement between the Parties.
- 15. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold District, its agents, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees, officials, officers, volunteers, and representatives ("Indemnities") free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, negligence (including the active or passive negligence of Indemnities, regardless of whether sole or otherwise, as allowed by law), causes of action, costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages or injuries, fines, penalties in law or equity, regardless of whether the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively "Loss") to the extent arising out of or incident to: 1) the performance or breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract (including but not limited to) the Contractor's use of the site; or 2) any acts, omissions, negligence, in connection with the performance of Services or otherwise arising from this Contract ("Indemnification"); or 3) the willful misconduct of the Contractor or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees. The Contractor's Indemnification includes, but is not limited to, the payment of all damages and attorney's fees, fines, penalties and other related costs and expenses.
 - a The Contractor's defense obligations (with counsel approved by District), shall arise immediately upon tender of any of the Indemnities, and the defense shall be paid at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, for any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against any of the Indemnities, notwithstanding whether liability is, can be or has yet been established.
 - b. The Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against any of the Indemnities, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding. The Contractor shall reimburse Indemnities, and each of them, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.
 - c. Acceptance of insurance certificates and endorsements required under the contract does not relieve the Contractor from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The requirements of this Section (Indemnification and Hold Harmless) shall apply whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.
- 16. Insurance. Without limiting "Contractor" indemnification, it is agreed that "Contractor" shall secure and maintain in force during the term of this Agreement a Commercial General Liability policy (Contractual liability included) utilizing an occurrence policy form, with limits of not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence, four million (\$4,000,000) annual aggregate limit. Business automobile Liability Insurance shall be maintained for owned, scheduled, non-owned or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence. In the event "Contractor" is working with students individually or providing professional services to students, "Contractor" shall maintain a policy providing coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims. In the event that "Contractor's" Commercial General liability policy excludes coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims shall be required to procure a separate or supplemental policy providing such coverage. The limits of coverage for the abuse and molestation policy shall be not less than \$2,000,000 per claim and \$4,000,000 aggregate. If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis then the following shall apply; 1) The retroactive date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work; 2) Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work; (3) If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a retroactive date prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of work. Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by District. The District may require "Contractor" to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses within the retention. The policy shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or the District.

The District shall be named as an additional insured on the policies by separate endorsement. A Certificate of Insurance and endorsements shall be attached to the Agreement as proof of insurance. The "Contractor" policy shall provide that it is primary such that insurance maintained by the District, if any, shall be excess and not co-primary. "Contractor" shall produce the policy for District, upon request.

- Independent Contractor Status. While engaged in carrying out the terms and conditions of the contract, the Contractor
 is an independent contractor, and not an officer, employee, agent, partner, or joint venture of the District.
- Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor agrees to provide all necessary workers' compensation insurance for Contractor's employees, if any, at Contractor's own cost and expense.
- 19. Fingerprinting Requirements. Contractor hereby acknowledges that, if applicable, it is required to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 45125.1 with respect to fingerprinting of employees who may have contact with the District's pupils. The Contractor shall also ensure that its consultants on the Project also comply with the requirements of Section 45125.1. If required by Education Code Section 45125.1, the Contractor and its consultants, prior to any of the Contractor 's employees, or those of any other consultants, coming into contact with the District's pupils submit through the DISTRICT fingerprints to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for the monitoring and supervision of employee(s) and/or affiliated constituents. Contractor will not begin work on the Project site until obtaining a DOJ cleared status through the DISTRICT. Contractor further acknowledges that other fingerprinting requirements may apply, as set forth in Education Code Section 45125 et seq., and will comply with any such requirements, including having Consultant certifies Consultants certify that none of these employees and/or affiliated constituent(s) will have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1. "Fingerprinting Requirements," is expressly understood and agreed to by the parties hereto:

Contractor is independently responsible for the payment of all applicable taxes.
- Assignment. The Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations without the prior written consent of the District.
- Binding Effect. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the contractor and the District
 and their respective successors and assigns.
- 23. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
- 24. Waiver and Amendments. This Agreement may be amended, modified, superseded, cancelled, renewed or extended, and the terms and conditions hereof may be waived, only by a written instrument signed by the parties or, in the case of a waiver, by the party waiving compliance. The waiver by any party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California and venue shall be in the appropriate Superior court in Fresno, California.
- 26. <u>Attorney's Fees.</u> The non-prevailing party in any dispute under this Agreement shall pay all costs and expenses, including expert witness fees and attorney's fees, incurred by the prevailing party in resolving such dispute.

27. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the company or to an officer of the corporation for whom it was intended, or if delivered to or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the person who gives the notice.

- 32. Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.

12. <u>Termination of Agreement</u>. Either District or Contractor may terminate this Agreement at any time for any reason upon thirty (30) days prior written notice. In the event of early termination, Contractor shall be paid for satisfactory work

performed to the date of termination. The District may then proceed with the work in any manner the District deems proper.

Notwithstanding the expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason (a) any provision of this Agreement that imposes or contemplates continuing obligations on a Party shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including without limitation, the rights and duties under Paragraphs 12, 13, 15, and 17; and (b) all undisputed fees due and payable hereunder through the termination date in accordance with Paragraphs 4 and 5.

13. Confidential Information

- a. For the purposes of this Agreement "Confidential Information" includes any written or oral information or data, disclosed by either Party to the other, which may include, without limitation, information relating to technical, financial, personnel, personal employee information, the network, corporate, administration, plan design, benefits or contractual affairs of either Party or a third party that has been identified as confidential or that by the nature of the circumstances surrounding disclosure ought reasonably to be treated as confidential.
- b. Contractor hereby agrees that it shall not disclose Confidential Information, and any materials, discussions, or other communications concerning Confidential Information to any person or entity, except to its own employees, contractor personnel, and to its attorneys, accountants, consultants and other professional advisors having a "need to know," and who are themselves bound by similar nondisclosure restrictions (collectively, "Representatives"). If Contractor becomes aware of any disclosure or use not in compliance with this Agreement, Contractor shall notify the District in writing within three (3) business days. Contractor shall use at least the same degree of care in safeguarding Confidential Information as it uses in safeguarding its own confidential information. Representatives shall be bound to comply with all terms of this Paragraph
 - 13.B. Upon the request of the District, Contractor shall provide a written acknowledgment from each of its Representatives that said Representative is bound by the terms of this Paragraph 13.B.
- c. Contractor's obligation under this Agreement to not disclose Confidential Information shall not apply to information that: (a) becomes generally available to the public other than as the result of unauthorized disclosure by Contractor or a third party; (b) is independently developed by Contractor without the aid, application or use of Confidential Information; or (c) was received by Contractor on a non-confidential basis prior to receipt from the District or from a third-party lawfully possessing and lawfully entitled to disclose such information.
- d. Disclosure of Confidential Information shall not be precluded if such disclosure is: (a) required pursuant to a valid court order; or (b) in the opinion of legal counsel for Contractor, is otherwise required by law, provided that in either circumstance:
 - Contractor shall furnish the District with a copy of the demand, summons, subpoena or other legal process to compel such disclosure;
 - ii. Contractor shall give the District reasonable prior notice of its intention to disclose Confidential Information in order to allow the District an opportunity to seek appropriate protection; and
 - iii. Contractor shall take all reasonable steps including, without limitation, the pursuit of a protective order, to restrict the disclosure of Confidential Information to the greatest extent possible.
- e. All Confidential Information provided by the District to Contractor is and shall forever remain the sole and exclusive property of the District. By granting access to Confidential Information, the District does not grant any express or implied right to Contractor to use, publish or disclose any Confidential Information. After its review of the Confidential Information Contractor will return to the District all Confidential Information disclosed to it (including copies or summaries of Confidential Information), or with the District's permission destroy the Confidential Information and certify in writing that it has been destroyed.
- 14. <u>Injunctive Relief</u>. Each Party acknowledges that a breach or threatened breach of this Agreement may cause immediate and irreparable harm to the District and that, to protect against such harm, the District may seek from a court of competent jurisdiction the issuance of a restraining order or injunction to prohibit any threatened disclosure

- or misuse of the District's Confidential Information. Such an action for a restraining order or injunction is in addition to and does not limit all other remedies provided by law or in equity or by agreement between the Parties.
- 15. <u>Indemnification and Hold Harmless</u>. To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold District, its agents, employees, Board of Trustees, members of the Board of Trustees, officials, officers, volunteers, and representatives ("Indemnities") free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, negligence (including the active or passive negligence of Indemnities, regardless of whether sole or otherwise, as allowed by law), causes of action, costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages or injuries, fines, penalties in law or equity, regardless of whether the allegations are false, fraudulent, or groundless, to property or persons, including wrongful death, (collectively "Loss") to the extent arising out of or incident to: 1) the performance or breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract (including but not limited to) the Contractor's use of the site; or 2) any acts, omissions, negligence, in connection with the performance of Services or otherwise arising from this Contract ("Indemnification"); or 3) the willful misconduct of the Contractor or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees. The Contractor's Indemnification includes, but is not limited to, the payment of all damages and attorney's fees, fines, penalties and other related costs and expenses.
 - a. The Contractor's defense obligations (with counsel approved by District), shall arise immediately upon tender of any of the Indemnities, and the defense shall be paid at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, for any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against any of the Indemnities, notwithstanding whether liability is, can be or has yet been established.
 - b. The Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against any of the Indemnities, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding. The Contractor shall reimburse Indemnities, and each of them, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided.
 - c. Acceptance of insurance certificates and endorsements required under the contract does not relieve the Contractor from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The requirements of this Section (Indemnification and Hold Harmless) shall apply whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.
- 16. Insurance. Without limiting "Contractor" indemnification, it is agreed that "Contractor" shall secure and maintain in force during the term of this Agreement a Commercial General Liability policy (Contractual liability included) utilizing an occurrence policy form, with limits of not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence, four million (\$4,000,000) annual aggregate limit. Business automobile Liability Insurance shall be maintained for owned, scheduled, non-owned or hired automobiles with a combined single limit not less than two million (\$2,000,000) dollars per occurrence. In the event "Contractor" is working with students individually or providing professional services to students, "Contractor" shall maintain a policy providing coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims. In the event that "Contractor's" Commercial General liability policy excludes coverage for sexual molestation and/or abuse claims shall be required to procure a separate or supplemental policy providing such coverage. The limits of coverage for the abuse and molestation policy shall be not less than \$2,000,000 per claim and \$4,000,000 aggregate. If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis then the following shall apply; 1) The retroactive date must be shown, and must be before the date of the contract or the beginning of contract work; 2) Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the contract work; (3) If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a retroactive date prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of work. Self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by District, The District may require "Contractor" to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses within the retention. The policy shall provide, or be endorsed to provide, that the self-insured retention may be satisfied by either the named insured or the District.

The District shall be named as an additional insured on the policies by separate endorsement. A Certificate of Insurance and endorsements shall be attached to the Agreement as proof of insurance. The "Contractor" policy shall provide that it is primary such that insurance maintained by the District, if any, shall be excess and not co-primary. "Contractor" shall produce the policy for District, upon request.

- 17. <u>Independent Contractor Status</u>. While engaged in carrying out the terms and conditions of the contract, the Contractor is an independent contractor, and not an officer, employee, agent, partner, or joint venture of the District.
- 18. <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u>. Contractor agrees to provide all necessary workers' compensation insurance for Contractor's employees, if any, at Contractor's own cost and expense.
- 19. Fingerprinting Requirements. Contractor hereby acknowledges that, if applicable, it is required to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 45125.1 with respect to fingerprinting of employees who may have contact with the District's pupils. The Contractor shall also ensure that its consultants on the Project also comply with the requirements of Section 45125.1. If required by Education Code Section 45125.1, the Contractor and its consultants, prior to any of the Contractor 's employees, or those of any other consultants, coming into contact with the District's pupils submit through the DISTRICT fingerprints to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for the monitoring and supervision of employee(s) and/or affiliated constituents. Contractor will not begin work on the Project site until obtaining a DOJ cleared status through the DISTRICT. Contractor further acknowledges that other fingerprinting requirements may apply, as set forth in Education Code Section 45125 et seq., and will comply with any such requirements, including having Consultant certifies Consultants certify that none of these employees and/or affiliated constituent(s) will have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45122.1. "Fingerprinting Requirements," is expressly understood and agreed to by the parties hereto:

- 20. <u>Taxes</u>. Contractor agrees that Contractor has no entitlement to any future work from the District or to any employment or fringe benefits from the District. District will not withhold FICA (Social Security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, state or federal income tax or disability insurance. - 21. <u>Assignment</u>. The Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any or all of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations without the prior written consent of the District.
- 22. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the contractor and the District and their respective successors and assigns.
- 23. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
- 24. <u>Waiver and Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended, modified, superseded, cancelled, renewed or extended, and the terms and conditions hereof may be waived, only by a written instrument signed by the parties or, in the case of a waiver, by the party waiving compliance. The waiver by any party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.
- 25. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California and venue shall be in the appropriate Superior court in Fresno, California.
- 26. Attorney's Fees. The non-prevailing party in any dispute under this Agreement shall pay all costs and expenses, including expert witness fees and attorney's fees, incurred by the prevailing party in resolving such dispute.

27. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the company or to an officer of the corporation for whom it was intended, or if delivered to or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the person who gives the notice.

This Agreement is intended by the Parties as the final expression of their agreement with respect to such terms as are included herein and as the complete and exclusive statement of its terms and may not be contradicted by evidence of any prior agreement or of a contemporaneous oral agreement, nor explained or supplemented by evidence of consistent additional terms.
- 30. <u>Construction</u>. The rule of construction that any ambiguity in an agreement be construed against the drafter of such agreement shall not apply to this Agreement.
- 31. Execution of Other Documents. The parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any and all other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.
- 32. Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.
- 33. <u>Board Approval</u>. For contracts in excess of \$15,000.00, the effectiveness of this Agreement is contingent upon the approval of the Fresno Unified School District Board of Education.

Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates (FM3) is pleased to present this proposal to conduct survey research among parents of students in the Fresno Unified School District (the "District"), as well as an optional survey of District staff. FM3 understands that the primary research objective is to better understand the preferred and most effective means of communicating with District parents, including how and where parents currently get information from the District, how and where they would like to get information, where they get other news and information, how frequently they use District resources and tools for information, the ways they'd prefer to share information with the District, and opinions about their ability to communicate effectively with the District, among other questions.

FM3 also understands the District would like to conduct a baseline parent survey in 2022 and subsequent annual surveys primarily among parents, as well as potentially among staff. FM3 strongly values our long-term professional relationship with the District, and we would be very pleased to work with you on this research. We are prepared to begin immediately and can complete the baseline research project within the District's timeline (prior to June 30).

As you may know, FM3 is a leader in providing accurate, actionable research that aids California's school districts and other local government agencies (and other entities) in achieving their communications objectives—which includes research to help determine the best ways to communicate directly with their audiences. Our research has helped local agencies throughout the state communicate effectively and successfully with specific stakeholder groups such as parents and agency employees, with voters (as demonstrated by our record of having helped pass more than 500 ballot measures for local California agencies, including more than 150 ballot measures for K-12 school districts), and with the public at large.

Just a few relevant examples of research conducted among parent populations, includes the following:

In 2020, FM3 has conducted a number of surveys of parents in California school districts to understand opinions
about their school districts' response to the COVID-19 pandemic and how information was communicated with
them at that time. This included parent surveys on behalf of Sanger Unified School District and the Manhattan
Beach Unified School District, to name a few. The various topics explored in the surveys included measuring
various ways the districts communicate with parents and how frequently parents turn to various sources of

information about their districts parent satisfaction in specific areas of their district's response, as well as the importance of various steps being taken to make school campuses safer, and ensure families have the resources and tools they need to deal with the challenges of distance learning.

- In 2018, FM3 conducted a survey of parents in the **Riverside Unified School District** (RUSD) to assess opinions of the school district's performance overall and in specific areas, priorities for the school district (including topics such as class sizes, safety and security, facilities, athletics, testing, diversity and inclusion, and technology), and interactions with RUSD staff (from classroom teachers to central office administrators). The survey also assessed aspects of District communication including the quality of information provided to those whose preferred language is Spanish and satisfaction with their child's school webpage and the district's webpage.
- In 2018, FM3 also conducted a survey of parents and community members in the Clovis Unified School District
 (CUSD) about communication preferences, and the readership of the District's local newspaper CUSD Today.
 The survey provided data about the kinds of information that parents and other stakeholders wanted to receive
 from the District, preferences for communication media, where they get their news now, and an analysis of the
 District's website.
- FM3 has conducted numerous surveys among parent populations regarding childcare issues, including two
 parent surveys and focus groups on behalf of the San Diego Foundation since 2020 (with parents of children 12
 and under), an online survey of California parents of children under age five for Ed Source, and research for the
 National Association for the Education of Young Children from 2015 to 2019 among parents, educators, and
 voters.
- FM3 has extensive experience conducing survey research for the City of San Francisco's Department of
 Children, Youth, and Their Families that included parent satisfaction surveys administered on-site by pre-school
 program staff, as well as multi-lingual citywide parent surveys, to assess preferences and desires for enhanced
 programming for San Francisco's young people.
- FM3 has also worked with the San Francisco Treasurer's Office and the Earned Assets Resource Network (EARN) to assess San Francisco Unified School District parent attitudes toward the Kindergarten to College savings program, and reactions to the program's marketing and branding materials. This research involved conducting a combination of survey and focus groups with these parents to better understand the values they hold toward higher education for their children and savings habits for higher education.

In addition to our firm's experience with the Fresno Unified School District and other school districts and conducting parent surveys, we will leverage our local knowledge and insight gained from statewide research we regularly conduct on educational issues to benefit the research we provide for the District. FM3 has worked closely with the California School Boards Association (C.S.B.A.) to understand parent and voter attitudes on education issues statewide, and a broad coalition of interests, including the Coalition for Adequate School Housing (C.A.S.H.), the California Building Industry Association (C.B.I.A.), and others, in the successful statewide effort to pass Proposition 51, a \$9 billion statewide K-12 and community college bond in the November 2016 Presidential Election. FM3 has served as the lead research firm for this coalition for more than a decade. Prior to our work with C.A.S.H. and C.B.I.A. on Prop. 51, FM3's research had already been utilized to pass six statewide education bond measures since 1990

which authorized a combined total of \$25.65 billion in funding. Currently, FM3 is continuing our research with statewide education groups and stakeholders regarding a potential statewide education measure in November 2022.

We feel our experience in the District combined with our experience conducting parent surveys makes us uniquely positioned to help you on this project.

METHODOLOGY AND WORK PLAN

FM3 understands the District would like to conduct a parent survey immediately (with the research completed by June 30) as well as subsequent parent surveys annually. And that the District may be interested in potentially conducting a staff survey (possibly in lieu of one or more of the annual parent survey). In the following pages, we first focus on our recommended methodology for the parent survey, as well as costs for the initial parent survey and follow up annual parent surveys. We then provide a brief description of the methodology and costs for a staff survey.

The Parent Survey

For the parent survey, FM3 recommends conducting a dual-mode survey (conducted online and via land and cellular phones), utilizing the parent contact information provided by the District.

The contemporary approach for gathering statistically reliable data is to employ the traditional telephone survey methodology alongside the latest online survey applications, with invitations to take the survey online distributed to potential respondents via email and (in the case of cellular phones) by text message. In instances where a potential respondent is randomly selected to take the survey online but does not promptly respond to the email invitation to do so (and a cellular telephone number for this individual is also available), FM3 will follow-up with a text message invitation, and an additional reminder as necessary. This relatively new survey contact approach has been found to improve response rates to online surveys.

Given the District's parent list does not contain email addresses for all parents, a dual mode survey is the most inclusive methodology because it allows parents without email addresses (or access to take a survey online even if they do have an email address) to be reached by phone. Furthermore, by offering three contact methods (telephone, email, and text), this methodology gives the highest proportion of parents the opportunity to participate in the survey.

Using this modern dual-mode survey methodology, FM3 collects survey data in two phases:

Phase I: Online Interviews

During this phase, FM3 will pull a randomized sample of District parents. Once FM3 has identified email addresses for the desired number of respondents, an invitation will be sent to the individuals for whom an email address is available. To encourage the greatest level of participation in the survey, we recommend using the District's actual electronic seal or logo for this email invitation, with the invitation electronically "signed" by the superintendent explaining that the District has hired an independent public opinion research firm to conduct a survey about issues

that are relevant to parents. The email invitation will provide a link for the parent to take the survey online. Three to four days after this initial email invitation is sent, a second reminder email will be directed to recipients who have not yet taken the survey, requesting that they do so.

As mentioned earlier, in addition to sending out invitations by e-mail, FM3 offers the option to send out invitations via text message to ensure a representative sample. In many cases, respondents' main access to the internet is through their smartphones. Recipients of the text message invitations will then be able to complete the survey through their smartphones. This approach is especially helpful to ensure the survey is more wide-reaching and captures the opinions of a representative sample of District parents.

Phase II: Telephone Interviews

Within a few days of the initial email's distribution, FM3 will conduct a thorough examination of the demographic characteristics of those who have taken the survey online. By comparing the demographic characteristics of those who have completed the survey online with the attributes of the District's parent population as a whole, FM3 will note specific subsets that are either overrepresented or underrepresented in the online sample.

FM3 will then conduct further interviews with additional respondents by telephone. The telephone interviews will be conducted among those parents who did not have an email address as well as those who do have email addresses but were underrepresented in the online sample, thereby producing an overall survey sample using both methodologies (online and telephone) that mirrors the District's parent population.

Further details on the proposed specifications and costs of the research are below. We first present specifications for the baseline parent survey to be conducted immediately, followed by specifications for annual follow up parent surveys. We conclude with costs and variations in methodology for a staff survey.

Figure 2 shows the cost for the research with a sample size of 300 and a length of 10 minutes. This price is comprehensive, and includes all costs for questionnaire design, sample acquisition and preparation, programming, email and text invitations, survey hosting, bilingual interviewing, data entry and analysis, and reporting.

STAFF SURVEYS

FM3 understands that the District is also interested in potential surveys with additional audiences, including staff (teachers and other staff). We anticipate a staff survey would be conducting primarily online given wide staff access and usage of e-mail. Some interviews would be conducted by phone for staff without convenient access, including maintenance staff. We estimate that 85 percent of the interviews would be conducted online. This survey would be conducted in English only.

Should the district choose to conduct a staff survey for one or more of the annual surveys, we would recommend a 15-minute survey to allow the breadth of questions needed to address the different issues or topics of interest to teachers, administrators, and other staff.

A 15-minute staff survey with up to 200 interviews would cost approximately \$19,500. A 15-minute staff survey with up to 400 respondents would cost approximately \$23,500.

Please be aware that I have been retained to represent the interests of Julio Estrada and Laura Delgado in their claim for injuries sustained in an automobile accident caused by your employee, Jesse Zapien on November 27, 2021. Please consider this to be a government tort claim pursuant to California Government Code, Govt. Code §§ 810 et seq. Kindly, direct all correspondence concerning this matter to my attention.

Please also consider this to be an evidence preservation request. Specifically, we request that you retain any surveillance footage you may have of the accident scene from the date of November 25, 2021, through November 30, 2021.

On November 27, 2021, Mr. Estrada and Ms. Delgado were in their vehicle, stopped behind another vehicle in the #1 lane of eastbound Belmont when your employee, Jesse Zapien, failed to stop and rear-ended Mr. Estrada's vehicle. Officer Katherine Gregory quoted Mr. Zapien in the Traffic Collision Report, stating "He got distracted by some of the signs in the area and looked away from the road for a moment. When he looked back up he saw that there were two vehicles stopped in front of him. He did not want to swerve into the next lane and risk running someone off the road or hitting them so he hit his brakes but was unable to stop in time". Attached is a copy of the Traffic Collision Report No. 21064995 for your convenience.

Ms. Delgado was taken by ambulance to the hospital and continues to treat for her injuries. Mr. Estrada continues to treat for injuries sustained in this accident.

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

Notification:

On 11/27/21 at approx. 1705 hrs. officers responded to the area of Belmont/Glenn for a 3 vehicle traffic collision. All times, speeds, and measurements are approximate and measurements were obtained through pacing.

Statements:

 Party-1 (Zapien) stated that he was driving V-1 (Ford) westbound in the #1 lane of E Belmont Ave at approx. 35 mph. He got distracted by some of the signs in the area and looked away from the road for a moment. When he looked back up he saw that there were two vehicles stopped in front of him. He did not want to swerve into the next lane and risk running someone off the road or hitting them so he hit his brakes but was unable to stop in time. He struck the rear of V-2, which propelled V-2 forward so that it struck the rear of V-3. The driver of V-3 (BMW) identified herself to Zapien as Emily Speer (or Spear) and provided her phone number. She took a picture of his CDL but did not provide any more of her information. While they were speaking they heard sirens and Speer drove away. Zapien stated that he could identify her if he saw her again.

Party-2 (Estrada-Delgado) stated that he was driving V-2 westbound in the #I lane of E Belmont Ave and was stopped behind another vehicle when he was struck from behind.

INJ-Delgado-Prieto was already being transported by EMS when I arrived and I did not obtain a statement from her.

Party-3 (Speer) left prior to officers' arrival and without providing the rest of her information. Based on the name and description given by Zapien, I located a possible matching subject with a DOB 6/29/92.

Summary:

On 11/27/21 at approx. 1700 hrs. V-3 and V-2 were stopped in the #1 lane of E/bound Belmont east of Glenn, possibly because V-3 was waiting to make a left turn. V-1 was unable to stop in time and struck the rear of V-2, which then struck the rear of V-3. The front passenger in V-2 complained of chest pain and was transported to the hospital by American Ambulance. The driver of V-3, Speer, began to provide her personal information to Party-1 but drove away when sirens approached.

Area of Impact:

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The AOI was determined by physical evidence (debris, location of vehicles) and statements.

AOI #1 (V-1 vs. V-2): The AOI was 33' S/of the north curb line of E Belmont Ave and 120' E/of the east curb prolongation of N Glenn Ave.


