Reading Option 1: Character Journal (Fiction)

You will choose a fiction title from the book list below. You will complete a journal entry from the point of view of the main character. In this journal, you are pretending to be the main character in the story. Describe a major challenge, you (the main character), faced and describe how you were able to overcome this challenge.

Be creative in your writing! Take on the characteristics of your main character. Make your writing sound like the character's own voice! Remember to use key details and major events from the book when writing your journal. Be sure to write in complete sentences, including capital letters & punctuation, and always your very best handwriting!
