

Summer Reading Assignment 2024

Welcome to Honors U.S. History 1! Our main textbook for at-home reading assignments will be The American Pageant, a thorough secondary source geared to the AP-US History Exam. While we will spend much time in class analyzing *primary* sources, we will also consider alternative *secondary* sources from time to time. Please read the following two secondary sources¹:

Respond to the following prompts in a Google Doc. **DO NOT EMAIL IT OR PRINT IT YET!** On the first or second day of school, you will receive instructions for either uploading the document to Canvas, using the document to complete an in-class, open-notes assessment, or both.

For each prompt, write a **brief paragraph of 3-5 complete sentences IN YOUR OWN WORDS²**. Evidence in support of your response should be paraphrased rather than quoted, and citations are **not** necessary. Be sure to restate the prompt, and pay close attention to grammar and spelling.

Prompts from Zinn reading:

1. **Contrast** Zinn's and Morison's views of Columbus.
2. Describe four (4) **examples of Spanish mistreatment of enslaved native on *encomiendas*** in the Caribbean islands, as chronicled by Bartolome de las Casas.
3. **Is Zinn convincing** in his claim that North American native civilizations were **not inferior** to European civilizations? **Provide examples** in support of your answer.
4. **How does Zinn respond** to Kissinger's claim that, "**History is the memory of states**"?

Prompts relating to the Galloway reading

5. What **evidence** does Galloway use to **refute the racist claim that Indians loved freedom while Africans were used to slavery**?
6. According to Galloway, **how did the way Natives became enslaved differ** between a) **North America** and b) **South America and the West Indies**? In his view, how should this **change the way we look at enslavement** throughout history?
