New Building Logistics

Walking paths from STEM


The temporary walkway for 8th graders to go back and forth from STEM has been drawn. The walkway will be 6-8 feet wide. It will go along the old gymnasium for spring of 2024 but will be changed to go through the current teacher parking lot once demolition is staged this summer.

New Building Logistics

Current 7th graders are having a schedule change.

5th period will flip with 6th period.

They will have lunch and connections later in the day now during 6th period.



Car Rider Procedures

For the 4th nine weeks, the car rider line will be accessible from Murray Lane to drop students off in front of the school and exit to Granny White.

For **2024-25 school year**, the car rider line will go back to the Foxland Hall Entrance on the Northside or "Gymnasium Side" of campus only.

Parents who drive their children to school will access the car-rider drop off and pick-up zone from Granny White Pike.

Parents can turn onto the road between Brentwood Middle School and Granny White Park, and they will see the new driveway.

Arrival

Doors will open at 7:25 AM at the main entrance and the gymnasium entrance.


All students will report to the gymnasium until they are dismissed to go to first period class at 7:35 AM.

8th Grade is dismissed first, followed by 7th grade, and then 6th grade.

If students want to eat breakfast, they may go to the cafeteria, but they must stay the whole time.

8th graders will not have time to stay and linger in the cafeteria once the 7:35 bell rings.

Late Start Arrival

Buses will run at the regular time.

Doors will open at 7:25 AM.

Students will be released to classes at 8:20 AM.

Classes will begin at 8:35 AM.

Dismissal Spring of 2024

School is dismissed at 2:57 PM.

All students will go to the sidewalk in front of the New Brentwood Middle School to be picked up at the car rider line.

8th graders will walk to current bus line to get onto the buses.

6th and 7th graders will exit to the south exit door of the new building to load buses at the current bus loading area.

Dismissal in the Fall of 2024

School is dismissed at 2:57 PM.

Students will go to the sidewalk along the gymnasium to be picked up for the car rider line.

8th grade students will need to walk from STEM to the bus line in front of the Brentwood Middle School building and around the front to get to the car rider line by the gymnasium.

Buses will pick up in front of Brentwood Middle.

8th graders will dismiss from STEM and walk to the front of BMS to load on the buses.

6th and 7th graders will exit to the front of the building to load buses.

Early Dismissal

The student will be called from class when the parent or guardian arrives at school and signs them out in the front office.


Parents picking up students will park in the spaces closest to the new Performing Art Center and enter the front entrance to pick up their students.

If you have an eighth grader, please allow for additional time if you have an early dismissal for your eighth-grade student.


There will be no dismissals after 2:05 PM.

Language Arts Classes

Standard Language Arts

Students will cover the state of TN 8th grade Language Arts standards.

Based on classroom performance in 8th grade, students will be recommended for English I (Honors) or English I (Standard) for freshman year at BHS.

Advanced Language Arts*

Advanced Language Arts classes extends the instruction by encouraging students to work more independently, focus on analysis, evaluation and synthesis of skills.

*Prerequisites

Students must consistently be in the 90th – 99th percentile on ELA TCAP/TNReady

Must have a 7th grade ELA teacher recommendation Superior work ethic

<u>Mathematics Classes</u>

8th Grade Math: Pre-Algebra

Students that complete this course will enter Algebra I in the 9th grade.

<u>Honors Algebra I</u>

Successful Algebra students have had at least an 85% in class, score an 85% on the Algebra placement test and have a teacher recommendation.

Students are required to take the TNReady EOC for Algebra I.

This class counts towards a student's high school GPA.

Honors Geometry

Students are required to take a TNReady EOC for Geometry. This class counts towards a student's high school GPA.

Teachers work with the small groups (2-4 students) to remediate the essential skills needed to put students on a path to success in the future.






