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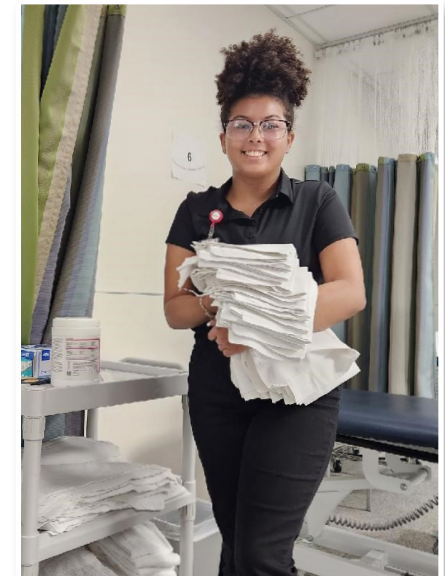
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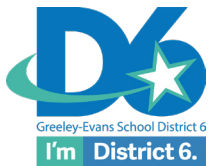
Project | SEARCH

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Between 18-20 years of age
- Currently enrolled in a local high school special education program or transition program
- Completed high school credits necessary for graduation
- Has not taken their high school diploma
- Eligible for services through the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation
- Have an Individualized Education Program (IEP)
- Have a strong desire to work
