This will also involve spending quality time building relationships; students studying Spanish will be encouraged to use their Spanish while on this trip.

International travel - Students will need a passport for International travel. Passports cannot expire before April 19, 2025.

Please do not select this trip if you are opposed to your student using lawn and general household tools or painting products. A separate power tool waiver will also be signed online designating which power tools your student may use.

Students can take one extra bag with them on the trip full of donations for the orphanage; extra baggage fee is not included in the trip cost. Families will be given more information about donations and luggage costs at the parent meeting. Please note that families will provide their own students' transportation to and from the airport on $\mathbf{October\ 19^{th}}$ and $\mathbf{25^{th}}$.
