STOPIT

All sites in our district have contracted with a new anonymous reporting system called <u>STOPit</u>. Students and guardians can use this system to anonymously share information to provide or get help as quickly and efficiently as possible. GATE TESTING

BUSD will be conducting assessments of students to determine GATE (Gifted and Talented Education) eligibility. In order for a student to qualify for GATE they must take the OLSAT, which measures the cognitive skills that relate to a student's ability to learn and succeed in school and examines both verbal and nonverbal abilities. Students in third grade and up are eligible to take the test. Testing will take place at Valley View during the school day on October 24th, and will take approximately 1 hour. Permission slips are due to the office by September 29th. For more information, read this letter from GATE coordinator Melinda Spooner.

SMART WATCHES AT SCHOOL

We have seen an increase in the number of smart watches on campus this school year. When watches or cell phones go off during the school day, it causes a major disruption to the learning environment. Smart watches are permitted on campus, but must be in "School mode" or turned off once a student arrives on campus. Your student will receive any messages sent in "School mode" upon exiting school mode at the end of the school day. WELCOME BACK: Nurse Notes!!

As our health team returns to school sites, we will be catching up email communication, updating immunization records, going through emergency cards and review of medical files to see if students may benefit from a health plan. It is critical for parents to make sure staff is informed of medical concerns and medications. If your child needs a medication while at school (even a prescribed inhaler they carry, or over-the-counter medication like ibuprofen), we have CA Education Code that requires a medication form (see more below). We hope your child had an amazing summer and is ready for the 2023-2024 School Year!!



<u>Health plans</u>: If your child has a health plan, it should be rolled over each school year unless their health concerns are resolved. Please reach out to **your child's** school health office or school nurse **if you wish to edit or review your child's plan.** If your child has a health concern that you feel might warrant a health plan, please let us know. If your child has a medication dependent health plan, e.g. epinephrine, albuterol, etc. or if your child needs any medication while at school (anything prescribed or **with an "active ingredient")** PLEASE complete the medication form with your physician as soon as possible. *A NEW FORM is required every year by CA Education Code for any medications. If you have a print out from your child's provider that lists the medication, route, timing (e.g. 9AM, PRN), frequency, diagnosis you can sign and attach it to our permission form. Immunizations: In general, kindergarten students, new students or those advancing into 7th grade have requirements for immunizations at these critical grade points that can be found at the document link below. *We must by law exclude students who do not meet the immunization requirement.* Students without immunizations in progress (and not yet due) or missing boosters, incomplete records, expired medical exemptions or belief statements will be excluded from school. If you receive an email or letter about missing immunizations, review these materials carefully especially *IF* your child has immunizations in PROGRESS. Review page two of the IMM-231 for spacing. If your child is OVERDUE, your child will be excluded.

WHAT ELSE? The first months of school tend to be WARM. Make sure your child is ready for school and has a water bottle to stay hydrated, is well-rested and is wearing sunscreen and has appropriate clothing for an active, warm **school day...**

Our health office loves donations to keep things healthier and happier – consider donating cleansing wipes, zip style plastic baggies and we can also use sport shorts or stretchy pants and sweats or hoodies and sweaters (*gently used items for elementary grades, especially in small to medium*). Parental or guardian permission on our district form is also required. The written statement MUST be renewed annually OR if there are any changes to the given medication as initially prescribed.

Dear Valley View Charter Montessori Parents,

The Buckeye Union School District will be conducting assessments of students, in October, to determine GATE (Gifted and Talented Education) eligibility. Although the program opportunities for GATE students are limited as the State provides little funding for GATE, the Buckeye Union School District is continuing its process of identification and, for those that qualify, some opportunities for enrichment/support in and out of the classroom continue to be provided.

In order for a student to qualify for GATE they must take the OLSAT (Otis Lennon School Ability Test) which measures the cognitive skills that relate to a student's ability to learn and succeed in school and examines both verbal and nonverbal abilities. A student needs to score in the 95th percentile on the OLSAT in order to qualify for GATE. This means that only approximately 5 of every 100 students taking the OLSAT will be GATE identified. The OLSAT exam will be offered at Valley View Charter Montessori during the school day on **Tuesday, October 24th** and will take approximately 1 hour.

In the past, students have been qualified to take the OLSAT exam by either a high score in the advanced range of a state standardized test or through a teacher recommendation process. Currently, the OLSAT assessment is open for students to take based on parent recommendation and student interest. When determining whether or not your child should take this rigorous test please consider the following guidelines:

- Does your child appear to have exceptionally strong intellectual skills for a student their age?
- Have teachers previously reported to you that your child demonstrates exceptionally well developed intellectual skills?

If the answer to one or both of these questions is yes, then they may be a good candidate for participating.

If your student participates and performs in the top 5% on the OLSAT, they will be identified as GATE eligible and will receive further communication from your school site regarding enrichments and supports that are offered.

If you would like to have your child (3rd-8th grade) take the OLSAT test, please complete the attached permission form and return it to your school office by September 29th. If there are any questions about whether to permit your child to participate in the OLSAT exam, please contact your student's teacher or site principal.
