

Overview of Transitional Kindergarten Program

Monday - Thursday:

8:25 - 3:05 PM; Friday: 8:25 - 2:15 PM

Recess and lunch PE - 2 times per week

Music - 2 times per week Library - 1 time per week



Transitional Kindergarten Model

Half of the day students join the general education classroom for a large group experience. This is co-taught with one general education teacher and one special education teacher.

Taking the Bus:

- Students must be eligible to take the bus.
- Arrive to the stop 5 minutes before pick-up.
- An adult must be at the stop for bus drop-off
- Bus tags are provided to help staff and drivers direct students to correct buses and stops.
- We are **Respectful**, **Responsible**, and **Safe** when we ride.

Chromebooks

- Kindergarten students use Touch-Screen Chromebooks
- Clever Badges used for login
- Students will receive these during the first week of school.



Consistent Dismissal Plans:

- Please help keep the dismissal plan consistent for your child.
- Please notify the school if plans should change.

How are sections determined?

The school does it's best to honor requests for morning or afternoon sections. On many occasions, first choices cannot be granted and the schools uses order of applications received to prioritize.



What if my child is sick?

Our <u>Wellness Policy</u> can be used to help parents determine if students should stay home. If a student is sick, please call the attendance line so that we may record the absence properly. Please leave a description of the symptoms and reason for the absence. A nurse may call with follow-up questions.

When Your Child is Absent...

- 24 hours a day. Please call in absences by 8:45 am.
- Please leave your
 - -Child's name
 - Teacher's name
 - Reason for the absence
 - Duration of the absence

If you do not call, the office will call you. The absence will be truant if we do not connect during the day.

What should my child bring to school?

- Students can bring school supplies the first week of school. Consider:
 - Backpacks
 - Water bottle
 - Wear comfortable clothing and shoes
 - Extra outfit (optional)

School Supplies

District 15 has partnered with TeacherLists to make supply ordering convenient and customizable. Order when you want — not deadlines to worry about; select which retailer to use — you can even mix and match; add items you want more of; remove items you don't need; choose pick-up or delivery (options vary by retailer); and more! It's all up to you!

What if I have a question?

The teachers will share their phone numbers and emails with families. Teachers will send information to families through newsletters to help keep parents connected to the classroom. 


Let's See If There Are Enough


