Definition of Title I:

- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help scholars who are struggling academically or at risk of falling behind.
- Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of student receiving free/reduced lunch.
- Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.

Larkmoor operates a Title I Schoolwide Program.

Schoolwide means:

- The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
- Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the State's performance targets.

To be a “Schoolwide” School:

- The school must have a free/reduced lunch count of at least 40%.
- The school must collect and analyze data that effects student achievement.
- The school must develop a comprehensive site plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.

- Student Attendance above 95%
- Students achieve 700 on Ohio State Test Grades 3-5
- Students achieve growth on I-Ready
- Monthly student PBIS recognition

Curriculum and Instructional Strategies:

- Larkmoor's curriculum is aligned to Ohio's academic content standards
- Wilson Foundations (K-2) and WRS (2-5) are programs providing reading support and intervention
- EnVision Math (K-5) is a comprehensive math curriculum
- Pearson are software programs that supplement the curriculum K-5.

Assessment:

- Larkmoor assesses student progress three times per year using I-Ready (state-approved tests) that measure academic growth
- Teachers also create their own formative assessments to determine areas of strength and weakness for each scholar
- Teachers meet weekly in teams to analyze student assessment data and design strategies to meet scholars' needs

Assessment Continued:

Ohio's State Tests are given each spring to measure student's knowledge and skills as follows:

- Results on state assessments are sent home with students in the fall.
- Results on I-Ready diagnostics are shared with parents during parent teacher conferences at the end of the 1st and 3rd grading period.
