

# Impact of Dual Credit on High School Records

 Earn <u>one unit</u> toward the high school diploma for each <u>three-semester-hour</u> college course successfully completed

 Student performance in dual credit courses will directly affect high school records and graduation requirements in accordance with S.C. state policy

 Each institution will award final grades according to the applicable grading scales

# **Course Withdrawal Policy**

 After the Drop/Add period, if a student chooses to withdraw from a TTC course:

> A grade of "W" will appear on the TTC transcript

 A numeric grade of "50" will be placed on the high school transcript

# Impact on LIFE Scholarship Eligibility

Grades in TTC courses impact your ability to earn and retain LIFE scholarships.

- First Year Grades are calculated into the high school GPA used to determine eligibility.
- Subsequent Years Grades are calculated as part of the ongoing College GPA used to determine continued eligibility.
  - 3.0 on 4.0 scale for <u>all college grades earned</u> at all eligible institutions




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#### **Dual Hold Approved Courses**

### **Tuition & Fees**

Students taking courses for dual credit are responsible for cost of tuition and books unless otherwise directed by high school or school district.

- Lottery tuition assistance is available for eligible students enrolled in 6 or more college credit hours during the same semester
- Need-Based Scholarships are available for high school students who qualify for free- or reduced- lunch programs

## **Tuition Costs for 2018-2019**

Tuition and Fees

– \$188.69 per credit hour (3-credit-hour course = \$566.07)

Some courses with labs will include additional lab fees

# **Lottery Tuition Assistance 2019-20**

- Students must be
  - SC resident (lived in SC for at least 1 year)
  - U.S. citizen
  - Enrolled in 6-credits during the same semester
- DC students do not need to file FAFSA
- Will cover roughly half of regular tuition (\$100 per credit hour)

# Need-Based Scholarships 2019-20

- Must qualify for free or reduced lunch based on traditional guidelines. Verification must be provided by school counselor
- Must be enrolled in <u>6 credit hours</u> per semester
- Must maintain a college GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Scholarship includes all tuition and fees in excess of Lottery Tuition Assistance; does NOT include textbooks
