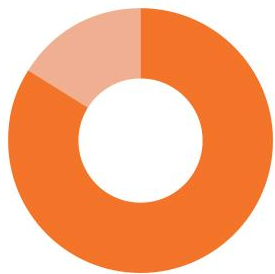

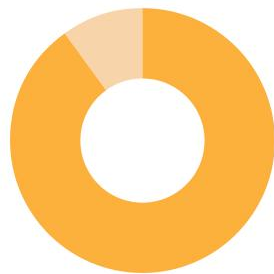

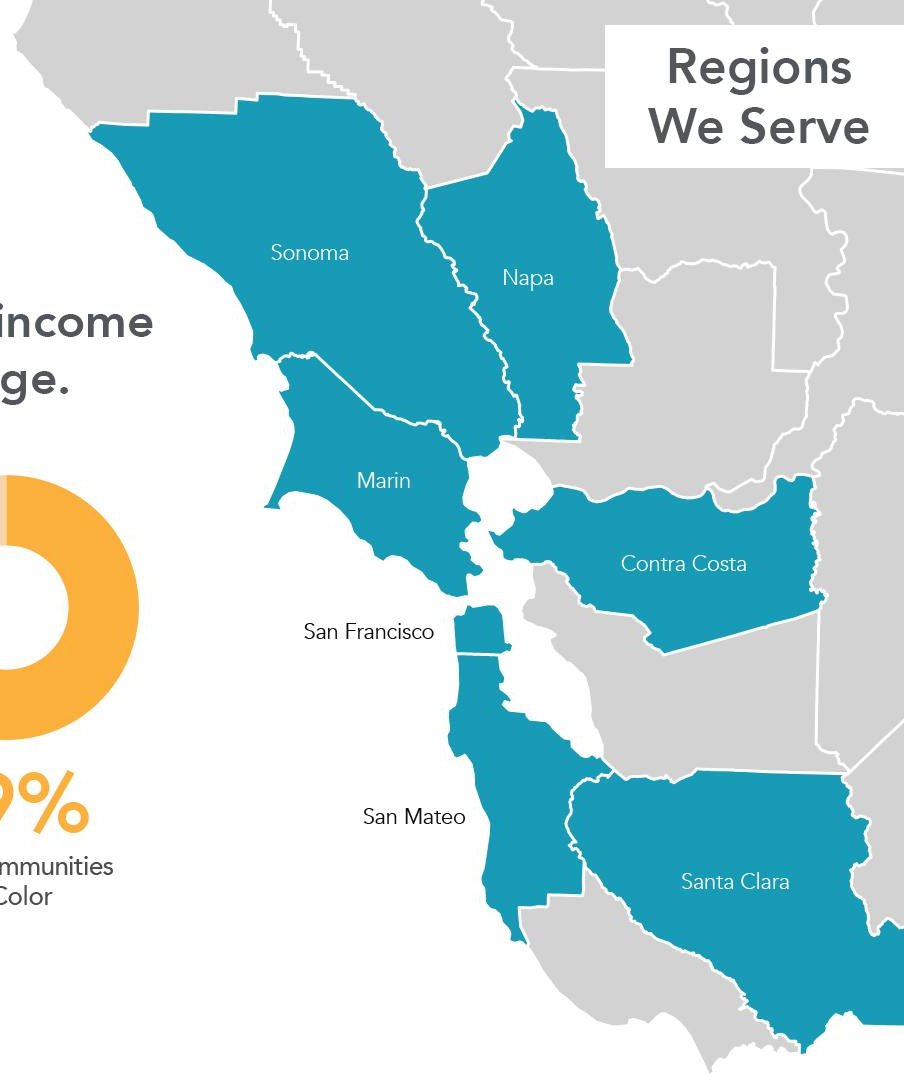

What is Financial Aid?

GIFT AID

Grants and scholarships that do *not* need to be paid back

EXAMPLES:

- Pell Grant
- Cal Grant A
- Gates Scholarship

WORK STUDY

Money earned through a job on or off campus

EXAMPLE:

- Student may work at bookstore or cafeteria on campus

LOANS

Borrowed money to be paid back after graduation

EXAMPLES:

- Direct Subsidized Loan
- Parent PLUS Loan

How Do I Get Financial Aid



FAFSA

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- <https://fafsa.ed.gov/>
- Opens **October 1st**
- Priority Closes **March 2nd**
- Includes both **State** and **Federal** Aid
- Application for **U.S. citizens** and **eligible non-citizens**



Step 1 When logging in to one of the websites listed above, click the link to create an FSA ID.

Tip: Important: Only the owner of the FSA ID should create and use the account. Never share your FSA ID.

Step 2 Create a username and password, and enter your e-mail address.

Step 3 Enter your name, date of birth, Social Security number, contact information, and challenge questions and answers.

Step 4 If you have a Federal Student Aid PIN, you will be able to enter it and link it to your FSA ID. You can still create an FSA ID if you have forgotten or do not have a PIN.

Step 5 Review your information, and read and accept the terms and conditions.

Step 6 Confirm your e-mail address using the secure code, which will be sent to the e-mail address you entered when you created your FSA ID. Once you verify your e-mail address, you can use it instead of your username to log in to the websites.

You can use your FSA ID to sign a FAFSA right away. Once the Social Security Administration verifies your information in one to three days, or if you have linked your PIN to your FSA ID, you will be able to use your FSA ID to access the websites listed above. 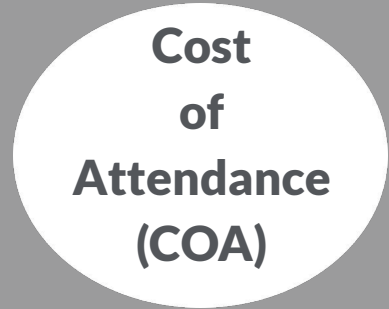

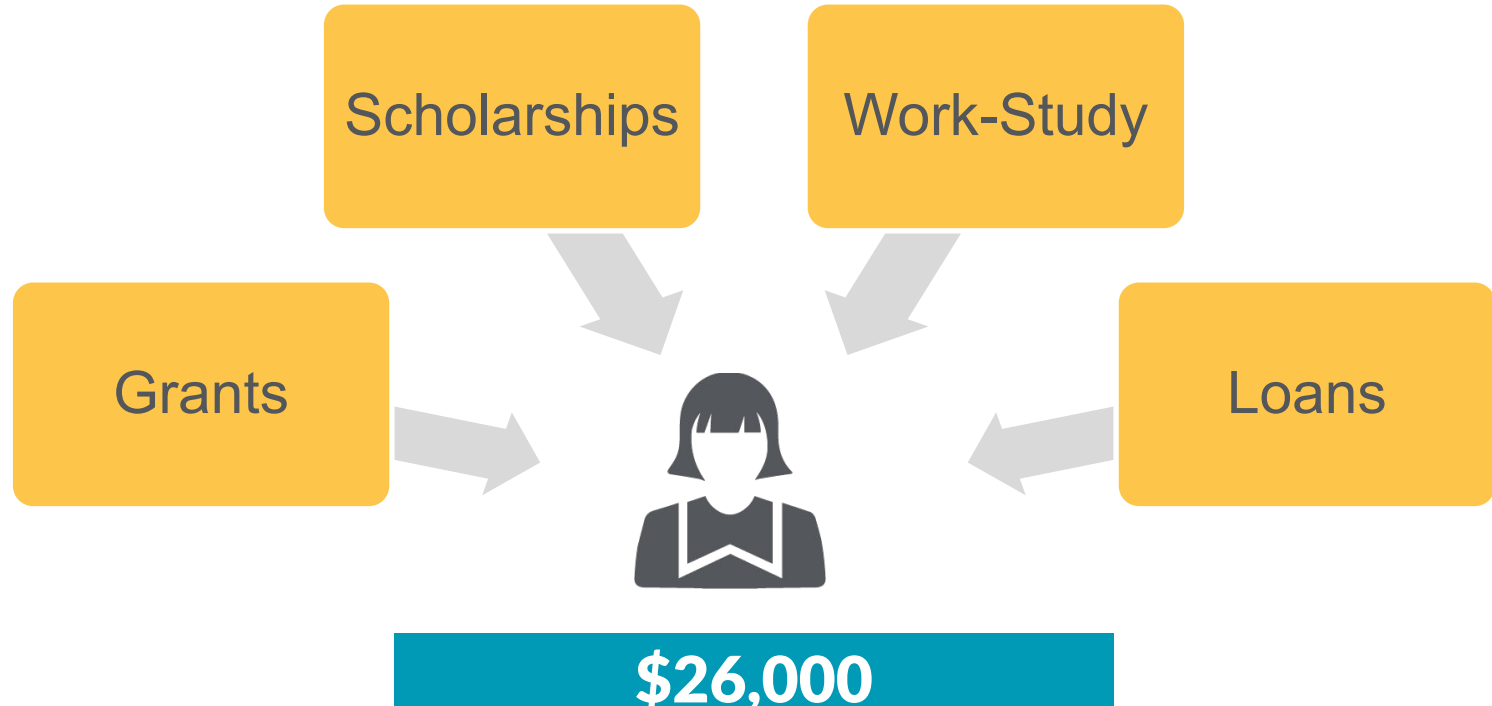

Pell Grant

- Up to \$6,345
- Based on EFC (Expected Family Contribution)

SEOG Grant

- Up to \$4,000
- Limited availability
- Apply ASAP



State Grants

CAL GRANTS

(FAFSA + CA DREAM ACT)

Cal Grant A

- 3.0 GPA
- UC: \$12,570
- CSU: \$5,742
- PRIVATE: \$9,084

Cal Grant B

- 2.0 GPA
- UC & CSU: \$1,656 (first year)
- Years 2-4: \$1,672 + tuition cost
- CC: \$1,656

Cal Grant C

- Technical/Career
- Certificate Programs
- Tuition Fee Waiver
- Stipend for Books & Supplies





Middle Class Scholarship

- UC & CSU
- Enroll at least ½ time
- Award varies by college and need
 - UC: \$5028 (The Max)
 - CSU: \$2,298 (The Max)



Work Study (FAFSA)

- Job subsidized by the federal funds
- Fits your schedule
- On-campus
- Competitive

Loans

LOANS

Government Subsidized

- FAFSA & Dream Act
- Fixed interest rate
- Interest deferred while in school
- 6-month grace period

Government Unsubsidized

- FAFSA Only
- Fixed interest rate
- Interest accrues while in school
- 6-month grace period

Private Loans/ Parent PLUS Loan

- Private:
 - requirements and interest vary
- Parent PLUS: FAFSA
 - for Parents only

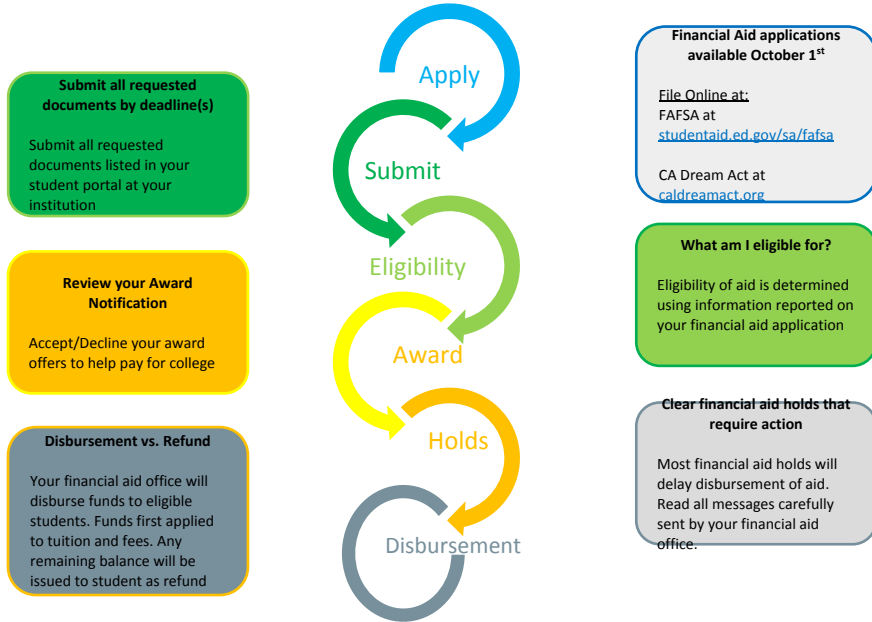


What is the CSS Profile

- Used by private universities
- Used to provide institutional aid
- Created by College Board
- Profile is overseen by financial aid counselors at institutions
- **Not required to be filled out by ALL students**
 - Okay for undocumented students to fill out
- NOT FREE! \$25 fee, and \$16 fee for each institution receiving financial information
- Think of CSS Profile as a **plus**

The 10,000 General SCHOLARSHIP

10,000 Degrees empowers young people from communities across the Bay Area to succeed in college and beyond.

The 10,000 Degrees Scholarships:

Scholarship

Each 10,000 Degrees scholar receives multi-year scholarship to offset educational expenses. In addition, scholars receive guidance and support interpreting financial aid packages and setting personal budgets.

College Success Advising

Each 10,000 Degrees scholar works one-on-one with an advisor throughout college, covering everything from time management and study habits to resolving roommate disputes and finding community on campus.

Eligibility:

- Demonstrate financial need
- Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 academic units/full time
- Must attend an accredited (WASC) College
- Must be a student of Marin, Sonoma and or San Francisco
- Undocumented students eligible!

To Apply:

- Apply online at 10000degrees.org under Scholarship Tab!
 - Student background and contact information
 - Basic household financial information
 - Answer two short essay prompts

Applications are due **March 2, 2021**
