


- What is the purpose of the writing?

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A "PERSONAL INSIGHT QUESTION" AND AN ESSAY?

The personal insight questions

Each question aligns to one or more of the 14 comprehensive review factors that campuses consider in their admissions decisions.

- Freshmen must choose 4 out of 8 questions
- Maximum of 350 words for each response
- All questions have equal value; there is no advantage or disadvantage to choosing certain questions over others
- Think of response as a written interview
- Responses are not essays, but should be well designed and have structure
- Complements information in the application without repeating it
- Provides a deeper perspective on the applicant's life experiences and/or accomplishments

The personal insight questions

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time.
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.
- 3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 6. Describe your favorite academic subject and explain how it has influenced you.
- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 8. What is the one thing that you think sets you apart from other candidates applying to the University of California?

Dos and Don'ts

DO

- Keep it positive
- Keep it about you
- Focus on high school
- Use everyday language
- Show growth, maturity, and love of learning
- Connect the dots
- Proofread and Edit
- Brag a little bit you've earned it!

Don't

- Write about others
- Place blame
- Play the victim
- Write it like a text
- Overuse a Thesaurus
- Repeat information
- Be sarcastic, overly witty, or bizarrely creative
- Write philosophically

Tips for Success

- Be reflective in your writing
- Be your authentic self
- Use vivid, specific details and examples
- Explain "what" statements with "why and "how"
- Be concise and succinct don't ramble
- Show your passion
- Use additional comments section, but don't write another personal statement
