# Principal's Message

#### Focus on Tam: What is CORE?

To support our goal of providing an outstanding educational experience for all students, this semester we have established the CORE program for 9th graders. This program is named CORE to reflect our belief that it will be central to learning and will help us close the achievement gap

and challenge all students at an advanced level. Our current design for 9th and 10th grade English and social studies has been modified with the intention of enhancing engagement, connection and academic progress for all students. We have established teaching teams for English and social studies that will remain together and teach the same group of students for two years, until those students complete 10th grade.

Studies have shown that this type of interdisciplinary/cross-curricular teaching increases students' motivation for learning

and their level of engagement. In addition, it provides our teachers with extensive opportunities to collaborate around curriculum and student needs. Rather than having to learn each new student and his or her learning needs at the beginning of the 10th grade, teachers will already have one year's experience with each of them, allowing a smooth transition and preserving essential learning time in the process. CORE is an essential next step in building collaborative communities and enhancing the student learning experience at Tam.

# **News from the College and Career Center**

#### **College and Career Center Services**

The College and Career Center has information on colleges, post-high school programs, financial aid, scholarships, college admissions tests, volunteer opportunities, summer programs and part-time jobs. For the most current information about college and career events, check the daily bulletin at tamhigh.org and PrepHQ.

#### **Keep Current with Email**

The College and Career Center sends occasional grade-specific emails to remind students and parents about special events, college visits, scholarship opportunities and last-minute scheduling changes. We do not share email addresses with anyone outside of Tam.

PrepHQ is our communications vehicle. If your student has already registered with PrepHQ, make sure your email addresses are current. If your student has not registered, this is how to get started: Log on to tamhigh.org, click on "Academics" and then "PrepHQ." Once on the homepage, go to "click here to register" and follow the instructions. Information about Career Center events will also appear in the Tam Family and Daily Bulletin.

#### Senior College Seminar September 23

Tam will sponsor a seminar for college-bound seniors and their parents on Thursday, September 23, at 6:30 pm in Ruby Scott Gym. Tam counselors will provide such need-to-know information as how to obtain letters of recommendation and how to send transcripts. A college admissions officer will discuss how colleges read applications and view the admissions process. College-bound seniors and their families are encouraged to attend.

During the fall semester the College and Career Center sponsors a number of special events for seniors including workshops on the early decision/early action process, writing the personal statement and completing the University of California and California State University applications. Make sure you are on the PrepHQ email list, so that you will receive updates and reminders of these events.

#### **PSAT**

**Juniors and Sophomores:** The Preliminary SAT, or PSAT, will be given at Tam on Saturday morning, October 16. The PSAT is designed to help students become familiar with the SAT and may help to improve future scores. Juniors who took the test last year are strongly encouraged to repeat it this fall.

Students may sign up September 7 through October 8 in the Counseling Office during breaks, lunch and after school. The \$30 fee is non-refundable. Checks should be made payable to Tamalpais High School. Complete information will be mailed home this month.



Students applying to the University of California must complete all testing by December. Certain impacted California State University campuses, including San Diego and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, require or prefer students to complete testing by November. For more information on the admissions requirements of the California State University and the University of California, go to: csumentor.edu and universityofcalifornia. edu/admissions.

**Fee waivers** are available for eligible juniors and seniors who cannot afford SAT or ACT fees. Students who receive SAT or ACT fee waivers may also be able to waive some college application fees. Talk with your counselor if you think you may be eligible.

Learning disabled students: Student with IEPs who wish to take the SAT or ACT should contact their academic workshop teacher or case manager for the necessary paperwork. Students with a 504 or regular education accommodations need to see their counselor for the paperwork. All paperwork requesting the SAT or ACT to approve an accommodation takes six to eight weeks to process. Parents of juniors and seniors are strongly urged to take care of this immediately.



#### **College Representatives at Tam**

Many college admissions representatives visit Tam in the fall to meet with students. Seniors and juniors are urged to take advantage of these opportunities. The visit list, available in the Career Center and on PrepHQ, is updated regularly. Announcements of visits also appear in the Daily Bulletin. Students need a pass from the Career Center and permission from their teacher to attend a college meeting during class time.

These schools have already made appointments to visit Tam this fall: American, Bates, Colgate, Colorado College, Connecticut College, Denison, Evergreen, Fairleigh Dickinson, Hamilton, Hofstra, Middlebury, Mt. Holyoke, Northeastern, Pacific, Pitzer, Tulane, Scripps, Seattle, Skidmore, Stonehill, St. Lawrence, Union, U of Alabama, U of British Columbia, U of Chicago, U of Denver, U of Hawaii, U of Oregon, U of Puget Sound, Vassar, Western New England College and Whitman.

#### **Work Permits**

Work permits expire in September. Students under 18 need to get a new work permit from Susan Gertman in the College and Career Center whether they are starting a new job or continuing a summer one. All jobs except babysitting and yard work require work permits.

# **Contemporary Works and Favorite Classics for CTE in 2010-11!**

Excitement is brewing at CTE this fall. The student theater company at Tam, Conservatory Theatre Ensemble (CTE), will serve up a generous helping of classic plays as well as modern fare in the upcoming season. The all student-run theater company will be busy with annual performances and fundraising events that help provide guest artist instruction and provide opportunities for design and production for all the shows. The plays offer something for everyone.

Additionally, the company produces two oneact festivals that are student-directed and feature the first and second year students in short plays that are an outgrowth and culminating experience for each semester. These one-act festivals are widely popular, producing many sold out performances.

The season opens with the classic Thornton Wilder play, *Our Town*, winner of the Pulitzer Prize in 1938. The story follows the lives of people within a small town called Grover's Corners as it illustrates and illuminates the cycle of life for its residents. The play masterfully portrays the universality of our human joys and frailty, casting its spell for generations of audiences who respond to its timeless message and memorable characters.

This CTE production will be directed by guest artist Joe Lucas and features a large cast of junior and senior advanced drama students, with some sophomores rounding out the characters of Grover's Corners. Student designers are busy working to bring the simple elements of Wilder's play to life. The production staff will complete the elements for a polished show.

Performances begin on September 28 and play through October 2 at the Caldwell Theatre located at the back of Tam's campus. Tickets for student and senior citizens are \$5 and adults are \$12. The box office opens at 6 pm. Doors open at 6:30 to claim your seats on a first-come, first-served basis. There are no advance ticket sales. Performances begin at 7 pm. Not to be missed!!


#### **FOOTBALL**
