
Conservatory Theater Ensemble's Season Opener

CTE's season opens with The Government Inspector by Nikolai Gogol. This play allegedly is based on a true story told to Gogol by another famous writer, Alexander Pushkin. It is one of the most well-known Russian dramas and is performed in theaters all

around the world.

The Government Inspector is a hilarious comedy about a small provincial town filled with con artists, corrupt government officials, and malevolent tricksters. The premise is simple; when the locals in a remote town in Russia learn that an undercover government inspector is coming from the capital for a surprise visit to evaluate and report back about their town, an unfortunate case of mistaken identity sends the village spiraling into a world of panic, greed, and corruption. Witty, smart and wildly satirical, The Government Inspector exposes the dishonesty of a secluded town with biting hilarity. As the Guardian puts it, "Gogol's splendid satire on greed, corruption and sleaze in not very high places" is sure to keep audiences engaged in the town's chaotic journey until the final curtain.

CTE's production is directed by guest artist Joe Lucas, who directed last year's wildly popular farce, A Flea in Her Ear. The play features a large cast of juniors and seniors in the advanced drama program Student actors and designers hit the ground running as rehearsals started the first day of school. Student designers are busy on working to tie together the larger-than-life situations the characters of The Government Inspector become entangled in. The production staff will create a small Russian town in Caldwell Theatre.

The play opens Saturday, October 1 and runs through Wednesday, October 5. Performances begin at 7:00 pm and are held at the Caldwell Theatre located at the back of Tam's campus. Student and senior citizen tickets are \$5 and adult tickets are \$12. The box office opens at 6:00 pm. Doors open at 6:30 pm and all seats are on a first-come, first-serve basis. No advanced ticket sales. Not to be missed!!

College and Career Center Services

The College and Career Center has information on colleges, financial aid, scholarships, college admissions tests, volunteer opportunities and part-time jobs. For the most current information about college and career events, check the daily bulletin at www.tamhigh.org.

Senior College Seminar October 6

Tam will sponsor a seminar for college-bound seniors and their parents on Thursday, October 6, at 6:30pm at the Mt. Tamalpais United Methodist Church, 410 Sycamore Avenue, across from Mill Valley Middle School. Tam counselors will provide important information such as how to obtain letters of recommendation and send transcripts. A college admissions officer will discuss how colleges read applications and view the admissions process. College-bound seniors and their families are encouraged to attend.

During the fall semester the College and Career Center sponsors a number of special events for seniors including workshops on the early decision/early action process, writing the personal statement and completing the University of California and California State University applications.

PSAT

Juniors and Sophomores: The Preliminary SAT, or PSAT, will be given at Tam on Saturday morning, October15. The PSAT is designed to help students become familiar with the SAT and may help to improve future scores. Juniors who took the PSAT last year are strongly encouraged to repeat it this fall.

Students may sign up September 12 through September 23 in the

counseling office during breaks, lunch and after school. The \$35 fee is non-refundable. Checks should be made payable to Tamalpais High School. Complete information will be mailed home this month.

PLAN

Sophomores will have an opportunity to take the PLAN, a practice version of the ACT exclusively for sophomores, on December 3. Colleges accept the ACT equally with the SAT. More information will follow.

SAT & ACT REGISTRATION DATES

Students may sign up online for the ACT at actstudent.org and SAT at collegeboard.com. Students cannot take the SAT and the Subject Tests on the same day. Register early for a convenient test site. Tam is not a test site.

Students applying to the University of California must complete all testing by December. Certain impacted California State University campuses, including San Diego and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, require or prefer students to complete testing by November. For more information on the admissions requirements of the California State University and the University of California, go to: csumentor.edu and universityofcalifornia. edu/admissions.

Fee waivers are available for eligible juniors and seniors who cannot afford SAT or ACT fees. Students who receive fee waivers may also be able to waive some college application fees. Talk with your counselor if you think you may be eligible.

Students with Learning Disabilities: Students with IEPs who wish to take the SAT or ACT should contact their academic workshop teacher or case manager to start the application process for an accommodation. Students with a 504 or regular education accommodations need to see their counselor. It takes six to eight weeks for the SAT or ACT to process an accommodation request. Parents of juniors and seniors needing accommodations are strongly urged to begin the process immediately.

College Representatives at Tam

Many college admissions representatives visit Tam to meet with students. Seniors and juniors are urged to take advantage of these opportunities. Students need a pass from the Career Center and permission from their teacher to attend a college meeting during class time.

Work Permits

Work permits expire in August. Students under 18 need to get a new work permit whether starting a new job or continuing a summer one. All jobs except babysitting and yard work require work permits. Work permits can be obtained from the College and Career Center.

An Exciting New Season of Plays for CTE in 2011-12

Enthusiasm for CTE's fall shows is beginning. Tam's student theater company, Conservatory Theatre Ensemble (CTE), will present both classic plays as well as modern fare in the upcoming season. The all student-run theater company is busy with its annual performances, as well as fundraising events to provide guest artist instruction and opportunities for design and production for all the shows.

The plays offer something for everyone. CTE advanced students perform in featured full-length plays. They also participate as designers, stage managers, and technical staff for all CTE productions.

Full-Length Plays and Performances

The season opens with an outrageous satire,
The Government Inspector, followed by an epic
story adapted from Homer's The Odyssey. In
November, improvisation will be the fare when
every night will offer something different and
unexpected in CTE's Improv Show.

Beginning in March, CTE will present Jane Austen's classic Pride and Prejudice. This play is sponsored by the Tam High Foundation Family Theatre Grant. An edgy, new adaptation of the well-known Cinderella story, The Ash Girl will follow. In April, the final production will be Rhinoceros, a wild absurdist play by the great Eugene Ionesco. The wide variety is sure to offer audiences plenty of surprises, laughs and drama.

One Acts

Additionally, the company produces two one-act festivals directed by students in the advanced drama program, a rigorous honors theater directing course. These festivals feature first and second year students in short plays that are an outgrowth and culminating experience each semester. These one-act festivals are widely popular, producing many sold out performances. The first festival is in January; the

second in May. The spring festival features one acts written by previous and current students.

All performances are held in the Caldwell Theatre located at the back of Tam's campus. Dates and times of performances can be found online at ctetam.org. Please note the schedule is different from previous years; it has been adapted for holiday and other Tam schedule conflicts.

Other Events

CTE student volunteers will operate the Fall Arts Festival Face Painting Booth in September. This is an early CTE fundraiser for the company. Kids can get their faces painted near the playground at Old Mill Park during the festival September 24 and 25. Stop by and say "hello" at this very fun festival that features the best of local artists.

This will be our biggest year yet with the largest number of students enrolled; a banner year for students and teachers is ahead of us.
