

OVERVIEW OF UC/CSU TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

60 transferable units, made up of:

- General education which must include:
 - CSU: Golden four (two English courses, one Communication course and one Math course) + 30 units of GE
 - •UC: UC English, UC Math and the 7 course breadth with "C" or better
- Major Preparation (specific to transferring institution)
 - Articulated course patterns for CSU and UC found at <u>assist.org</u>

^{*}Private and out-of-state will have their own specific requirements

WHY DO YOU NEED OUR HELP?

Every campus has different requirements, every major has different requirements, make sure you are taking the right classes to meet your goal!

WHEN SHOULD YOU GET HELP?

Every time your plan/goals change, check in to see if you are still on the right track. It's never too early or late to get support!

WHERE CAN YOU TRANSFER?

(AND HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?)

- UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA SYSTEM
 PRIVATE/OUT-OF-STATE
 - CA resident = \$15,000
 - Non CA-residents = \$45,000
- CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM
 - CA resident = \$7,000
 - Non CA-resident = \$16,000

- ★ TUITION = \$50,000
- BUT may have more financial aid available!

UPPER-DIVISION TRANSFER

60 Units = "Upper-Division Transfer"

Students transferring from a CA Community College as an upper division transfer to UC & CSU get admissions priority

For UC and CSU at the junior transfer level, only the community college GPA & coursework are considered. HS performance not considered & SAT/ACT not required

SOME CSUs are now accepting lower division transfer, but you don't get all the same benefits

UC TRANSFER - GUARANTEED ADMISSION (TAG)

Only available to CA community college upper division transfers

Six UC's (**UCD**, **UCI**, **UCM**, **UCR**, **UCSB**, **UCSC**) participate, students choose ONE campus to TAG to (can still apply to others)

UC transferable GPA required range is 2.7-3.5 depending on specific campus and major.

Students must meet campus-specific TAG requirements to qualify

Although **UCB**, **UCLA** and **UCSD** do not participate in TAG, students can apply through the regular junior admissions cycle. Average UC transferable GPA for transfers were: UCB (3.65-3.97), UCLA (3.8-4.0), UCSD (3.48-3.91)

CSU TRANSFER — ADMISSION GUARANTEE

AA/S-T (ADT)

Benefits:

- Local admission priority
- GPA bump
- Redirection
- 60 units after transfer

Requirements:

- 60 CSU-transferable units, a 2.0 cumulative CSU-transferable GPA (2.4 for non-resident students or 2.8 for international students), and the "golden four" (most CSU campuses require a letter
- grade of "C" or better in each "golden four" course for admission: 2 English, 1 math, 1 oral communication class)
- Students must complete a full CSU GE or IGETC pattern
- Students must complete the major coursework specified for the AA-T/AS-T degree

CSU: Transfer Success Pathway

Benefits:

- Guaranteed admission to the CSU and major of your choice
- Extra support from the designated campus

Requirements:

- Varies by major/campus
- Must be a recently graduated high school student
- Enroll by 9/30 of your first year at COM

PRIVATE AND OUT-OF-STATE TRANSFER

- No articulation agreements: generally less restrictive admissions requirements BUT transfer of all credit is not guaranteed.
- Often you can transfer with only 24-30 units, and without any specific major prep or GE pattern
- Each college/university will have it's own requirements the best resource for admission information is each school's website
- Financial aid is still readily available!
- SOME THINGS TO NOTE:
- Deadlines are different and often later
- Common app looks different for transfer
- <u>Transfer acceptance rates</u> may be very different than for freshman admissions, in either direction


