**Schedule Errors:** The first few day of school, the counselors will be meeting with students who have errors on their schedule. Such as:

- You have been placed in the incorrect level, or class

Students will be required to complete a **Schedule Change Request** (available in the Counseling Office, and will also be available online) to request changes regarding dropping AP/H classes, or changing electives. We will do our best to accommodate changes; however, many electives are full at this time. The counselors will send passes for students, if the schedule change can be made.
