This interview practice will prove invaluable as our sophomores seek opportunities to participate in local youth apprenticeships (YA) as early as this coming summer. ATECH students seeking a YA will have to submit a resume, apply, and interview with one or a number of participating businesses who offer YA positions. Eligible ATECH students who are selected as candidates will then be able to work for a local business as a youth apprentice. YA students will earn valuable experience on the job as they explore opportunities in their chosen career fields amassing a minimum of 450 hours of actual work experience over the course of the summer in addition to time spent working during the school year where they may work as a part of their school day. Participating YA students also earn school credit for work based learning and they get paid a very competitive wage.
