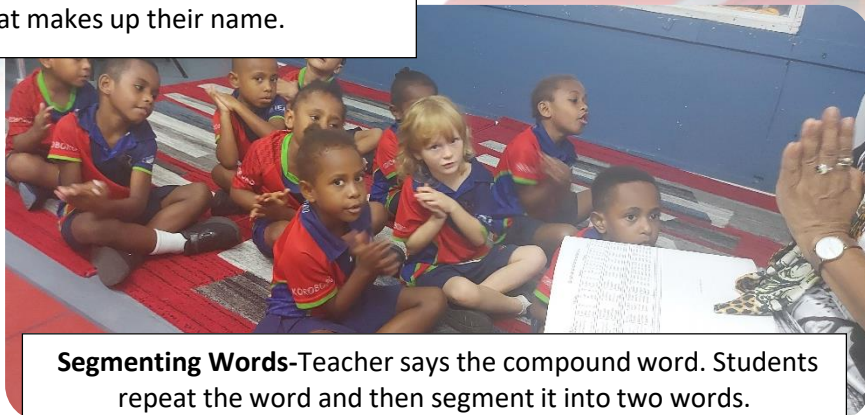
Brief Snapshots during a Phonics Lesson in PREP LP Classroom



Onset Fluency-Teacher says the word. Students repeat the word and isolate the onset or the beginning sound.

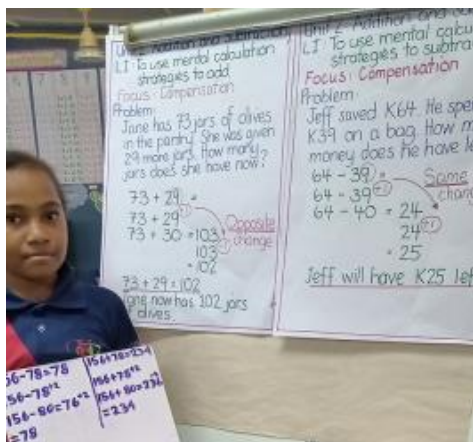
Top: English lessons have us working on Interactive and Shared Reading, Word Study and Writing. Below: We read scripts to improve our fluency.

We know what our positive qualities are and use them in our learning and with those around us.

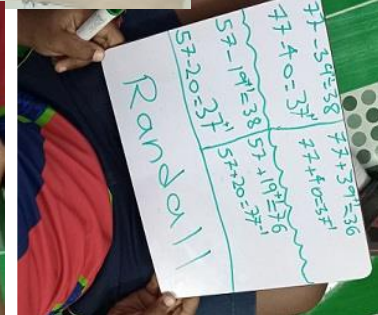
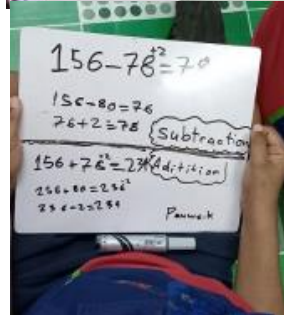
We worked on our SMART goals and Vision Boards. We have plans for our future!

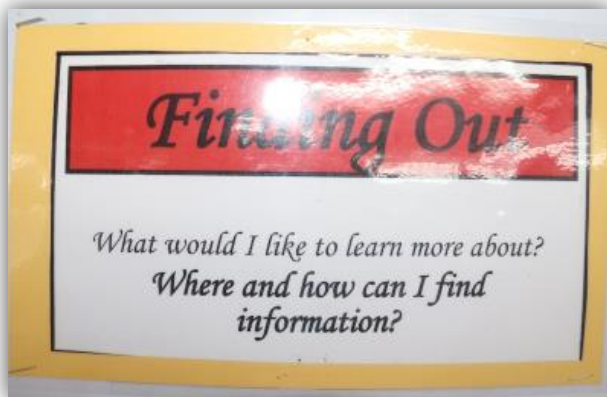
Sneak Peek of Inquiry Learning in 6MP Class

“The More you Inquire, the More you Know”

Tuning into the Inquiry Learning Strand of Social Organizations and Human Relations, the curious 6MP students tapped on their background knowledge about these words: **Rights**, **Roles**, and **Responsibilities** or, as we say, the 3R. They jotted down what they know, their wonderings, and what they would like to know about these words as we inquired further into the essential question: **How do we manage and develop expectations and strategies?**

Rich classroom discussions helped students identify the different groups that live within a society, such as students, working-class people, street vendors, etc. Students' background knowledge about these different groups enabled them to list the roles and responsibilities of the people within these groups.

Curiosity led students to carry out a case study on a group within the society to explore how the



behaviour of individuals affects group effectiveness in their community. They will be finding out about student collaboration during group work in the classroom, and these are some questions they will use to gather information about the behavior of individuals in this particular group:

- What is the name of the group you will focus on?
- Who makes up the group?
- Can you recall a specific example when a student's unacceptable behavior disrupted a group activity in your classroom?
- How did the disruptive behaviour affect the overall effectiveness of the group during that particular activity?
- What were the main challenges the group faced as a result of the disruptive behaviour?
- Were there any immediate consequences or reactions from the other group members in response to the disruptive behaviour?

Inquiry Learning is fun when students are engaged in many exciting and innovative activities that will enhance their knowledge about the topic of study.

*In inquiry learning, we don't just wonder; we inquire, as it is believed that **the more you inquire, the more you know.***
