# Goals for Student Achievement

### **District Goals**

- ⇒ By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, student achievement on state assessments will improve by 3%.
- ⇒ Reduce discipline removals from regular classroom settings by 3% annually.

#### **School Goals**

- ⇒ Increase academic rigor for students by providing targeted literacy instruction that increases the number of students earning proficient or better rating on the Georgia Milestones Assessment by 3% by the 2024-2025 school year.
- ⇒ Thomas County Middle School will reduce the number of students assigned to ISS/OSS by 3% by the end of the 2024-2025 school year.

## Communication about Student Learning

- ⇒ Teachers will ensure regular, two-way, meaningful communication with parents in family friendly formats by corresponding via email, phone, or conference as needed.
- $\Rightarrow$  Teachers send text messages through *Remind*.
- ⇒ TCMS sends a progress report home at the midterm of each nine weeks in September, November, February, and April.
- ⇒ TCMS sends a report card home each nine weeks: October, January, March, and May.
