Furry Friends

The school site is a dog free zone. Whilst we understand that it is lovely to bring your furry friend to collect children from school, especially whilst the weather is nice, we do ask they you do not congregate or tie dogs up by the gate. Some adults and children have fear of dogs and



should be able to walk in and out of the gate without worry.



Attendance

The whole school attendance for last week was **90.6%**.

Your child should only be staying at home if they are too unwell to be in school or if they have a high temperature. Children with symptoms of hay fever can still come into school. They can be given allergy medication at home before they come into school. We have air purifiers in the rooms that are most effected.

If your child has a light cold or cough, they should still be attending school. If your child is sick, they can return to school 48hrs after the last bout of sickness.

Please ensure any medication is administered before they arrive at school. School can only give medication to children that has been prescribed by the doctor at a dose of four times a day (anything less than this, the prescribed dosage will fall outside of school day times).

Road Safety

It is incredibly important, given this increasing amount of traffic to be driving and parking consciously outside of the school. Parents are reminded that it is not safe to 'pull up' outside of the school gates to drop children off.

If you **need** to drive to school, please us the parking opposite bays opposite the school or park a few streets away and walk the short distance up to school. You can leave five minutes earlier to give yourself more time to find a suitable parking space.

We cannot police the streets ourselves and rely on parents/carers to be driving safely when outside of school. We understand that it is busy and that at times, this might get frustrating however you must always put the pedestrians safety first.

SOCIAL MEDIA AGE LIMITS AND ADVICE



We have seen a rise in issues caused by the inappropriate use of social media. As a school, we can only control what the children do in the school day. We have no access to their devices to ensure they are using them safely so we ask that parents are consciously checking their child's devices to ensure they are using social media and messaging apps appropriately. Children are taught about cyberbullying at school but we need the support from parents to ensure the standards children are

expected to follow online are being taken seriously.

Things To Keep In Mind

Social media can be a dangerous place for children. They are exposed to things that are unsuitable for their age.

Even if you give consent for your child to use one of these applications, you should still monitor their use of the apps to ensure they are using it safely.

Internet browsers on devices should also be monitored, even though they have no age restriction.

Is Your Child Addicted To Their Device?

We are noticing that an increasing amount of children are using their devices as entertainment for the majority of their evenings/weekends.

Children should be limited to the amount of time they are spending on their devices.

They shouldn't need to rely on their devices for entertainment as this can cause them to miss out of socialising in person with their peers which will gain them valuable social skills.


